August Quarterly Festival

August 22, 2021 - August 29, 2021

Corner of Water & South Street, Wilmington Riverfront Area, Wilmington, DE 19801

Big August Quarterly is an annual religious festival held in Wilmington, Delaware (sometimes called "Big Quarterly" or "August Quarterly"). Begun in 1814 by Peter Spencer in connection with the "quarterly" meeting (or "conference") of the African Union Church—of the four meetings during the year, the one in August became the "annual conference" of the Church when ministers' assignments for the next year were announced, among other business—it was a time for free blacks and slaves alike to come together (from the multi-state area) and celebrate their faith with singing, dancing, testifying, and feasting. It is the oldest such celebration in the country.

The August Quarterly became a kind of Independence Day for Black people on the Delmarva Peninsula. In the early years of the festival "abolitionists and Underground Railroad conductors of the stature of Thomas Garrett and Harriet Tubman were often in the Wilmington area to assist slaves who chose to escape". The Big Quarterly has remained a time of reunion, religious revival and celebration of freedom for the people in and around Wilmington, Delaware.

Dear Coleman Members,

On Behalf of the Finance Team, thank you for being a faithful member of Coleman Church and continuing to support the church with your Tithes and Offering. As of June 30, 2021, our total Tithes and Offering totaled \$58,268.50 or (42%) of the budget-

ed \$140,000.00 Tithes and Offering income. Keep in mind, Tithes and Offering is utilized for the operations of Coleman Church such as:

- Salaries, \$36,346.15(including employee taxes) continue to pay our em ployees during the pandemic to avoid loss of income.
- M&T Bank- \$6,735.30 Church mortgage, to ensure we have a place to worship once the restoration and renovation are completed.
- Church Mutual \$3,190.84 Insurance premiums on all our properties (church, parsonage, and rental house) to ensure all properties are ade quately covered. In addition, we want to make sure we continue to pay our insurance premium since Church Mutual is a great partner as Coleman is going through the rebuilding process.
- Utilities (church & parsonage) \$4,206.42 Telephone, Electric, Water, Sew er & Trash Service
- Apportionment (Conference & District) \$4,433.68 fulfills Coleman's obligation as being part of the United Methodist Conference.

We appreciate your ongoing support; you are a valued member of our church family, and your financial support is making a difference. Please look for your mid-year giving statement which will be coming in the mail sometime next week.
