<sup>19</sup> Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, <sup>20</sup> teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, **I am with you always, to the end of the age.**"

Matthew 28:19-20

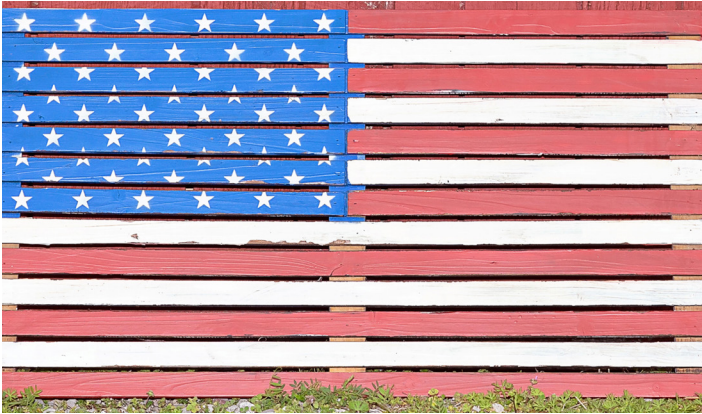

## Health & Wellness: *A Message from Scott Morris, M.D., M.Div.*

James Baldwin once wrote, “Children have never been very good at listening to their elders, but they have never failed to imitate them.” Recently, I have thought long and hard about what it means to be an American. What are the characteristics that make me proud of my country and the people I share this land with? Here are ten attributes I hope our children come to imitate.

**1. Americans believe in showing kindness to strangers.** As a country of immigrants, we know the impact of welcoming those who come to our shores seeking safety and hope. Kindness defines how we greet all strangers.

**2. We believe in forgiveness.** Americans are the most forgiving people in the world. It doesn’t always happen, but isn’t that what we should strive to do?

**3. We bind up our wounds together.** Abraham Lincoln has been invoked in a variety of ways lately. My favorite Lincoln quotation is this: “I don’t like that man. I must get to know him better.” I hope we can remember Lincoln’s second inaugural address, given soon after the end of the Civil War, when he pledged to go forward “With malice toward none; with charity for all; with firmness in the right, as God gives us to see the right, ... to bind up the nation’s wounds.” These words should guide us again.

**4. Compromise is not a dirty word.** The American Constitution was intended to make “compromise and accommodation” the norm in our political world. I

want to believe we can return to a time when compromise is an aspiration.

**5. We are part of the larger world.** I am desperate to return safe travel around the world. I love seeing other cultures. It makes me expand my own view of the big beautiful earth God created. Without this view, the world we inhabit shrinks.

**6. We are worthy of trust.** After World War II, America became the leader of the Free World because we were seen as trustworthy. I pray we are once again seen as worthy of trust.

**7. We are a country of laws.** Laws are written in the best interest of our whole society, not just to benefit a few. When did that change?

**8. We use our manners.** I have lived most of my life in the South. I was taught to say, “Please” and “Thank you.” I want our kids to do the same.

**9. We honor service and sacrifice.** Here of late, it feels to me that we have made it trivial to honor those who serve. Whether the military, first responders, teachers or health care workers, people truly engaged in service do so for a lifetime. America has been built and sustained by these people. I hope we can commit ourselves to honor them in ways beyond applause.

**10. We hold our freedoms with respect for all.** The First Amendment gave us a right to speak freely and worship God in the way we choose. These values drove the Pilgrims, the Irish, the Italians, the Mexicans, and countless others to come to America. We must respect these virtues and allow people to exercise them.

This week, I hope and pray that all Americans will remember the things that have made our country strong. Yes, we will elect a president. But the fundamental nature of being an American does not depend on a single individual; it depends on our collective nature and the principles we practice.

Together we can humbly move forward toward a dream our children, too, will embrace.
