Walking

¹⁶ I say then: Walk in the Spirit, and you shall not fulfill the lust of the flesh.

Galatians 5:16, NKJV



Health & Wellness: From our Parish Nurse

This newsletter comes from the CDC (Centers for Disease Control and Prevention)

Question: Are the Covid-19 vaccines from Pfizer and Moderna similar to conventional or traditional vaccines?? Answer: No. These vaccines are created using mRNA technology.

mRNA vaccines are a new type of vaccine to protect against infectious disease. To trigger an immune response, many vaccines put a weakened or inactivated germ into our bodies. Not mRNA vaccines. Instead they teach our cells how to make a protein-or even just a piece of a protein-that triggers an immune response inside our bodies. That immune response, which produces antibodies is what protects us from getting infected if the real virus enters our bodies.

A closer look at how Covid-19 mRNA vaccine works: Covid-19 mRNA vaccines give instructions for our cells to make a harmless piece of what is called the "spike protein." The spike protein is found on the surface of the virus that causes Covid-19. Covid-19 mRNA are given in the upper arm, deltoid muscle. Once the instructions (mRNA) are inside the immune cells, the cells use them to make the protein piece. After the protein piece is made, the cell breaks down the instructions and gets rid of them. Next, the cell displays the protein piece on its surface. Our immune systems recognize that the protein doesn't belong there and begins building an immune response and making antibodies, like what happens in a natural infection against Covid-19.

At the end of the process, our bodies have learned how to protect against future infection. The benefit of mRNA vaccines, like all vaccines, is those vaccinated gain the protection without having to risk the serious consequences of getting sick with Covid-19. cause Covid-19. They Do Not affect or interact with our DNA in any way. mRNA never enters the nucleus of the cell, which is where our DNA (genetic material) is kept. The cell breaks down and gets rid of the mRNA soon after it is finished using the instructions.

> mRNA vaccines have been studied before for flu, Zika, rabies, cytomegalovirus (CMV). As soon as the necessary information about the virus that causes Covid-19 was available, scientists began designing the mRNA instructions for cells to build the unique spike protein into an mRNA vaccine.

Beyond vaccines, cancer research has used mRNA to trigger the immune system to target specific cancer cells.

I thought this information would be a helpful read. If you have any concerns do not hesitate to reach out to me by phone. If you do not have my number, it is in The Chimes or call the office staff.

February is heart month. Please do not postpone your yearly or six month check ups. As you know there are options to check in with your medical team. The healthcare organizations are being as flexible and creative in making sure we are seen or heard from without delays.

Please remember to wear your masks. Dispose of your disposable masks after a day of wearing them. Wash your cloth masks in hot water and put them in the dryer. Stay six feet apart from each other, avoid crowds, and remember to wash your hands frequently and well (remember to sing the ABC's slowly.). Keep up the good work!

Winter has arrived and Jeremiah is in full swing!


- Planning for 2021 planning LOVE Rockford is in its early stages





Musical Notes

Music has always played a very important part in our church services at Court Street, especially during Lent. For the next three months, this article will feature some of the better-known hymns that we have sung throughout the years, and will give a little background about the composers, the lyrics, or the hymn tunes. Though we can't be together yet, reading these articles may take you back to a time when you did sing these with our congregation, and felt their impact on your life.

This information comes from *Companion to the United Methodist Hymnal* by Carlton R. Young, published in 1993.

Lord, Who Throughout These Forty Days Words: Claudia F. Hernaman

p. 269 United Methodist Hymnal Music: Annabel Morris Buchanan

This hymn, based on the temptation of Jesus, focuses on the words of Matthew 4:1-11, Mark 1:12-13, and Luke 4:1-13. It first appeared in Claudia Hernaman's *Child's Book of Praise: A Manual of Devotion in Simple Verse*, in 1873. It is the author's only hymn still in common use and one of the very few that relates to the Christian Year from Ash Wednesday to Easter. This version of the melody in our hymnal is from Buchanan's *Folk Hymns of America*, 1938 and was based on her recollection of the tune as sung by her grandmother to the words of the folk hymn *O land of rest, for thee I sigh*.

Ah, Holy Jesus p. 289 United Methodist Hymnal Words: Johann Heermann Music: Johann Cruger

Heerman's text was written during the Thirty Years' War, 1618-1648. The German text was published in fifteen stanzas as the "cause of bitter sufferings of Jesus Christ and to consolation from his love and grace." It is considered a masterpiece of devotional poetry.

The tune is a chorale, and Cruger made it possible for choir, organ, instruments, and congregation to all participate at the same time. It is characterized as a "cross and comfort hymn."


