

WEEKLY MILESTONES

DEVOTIONS

Read: Mark 9:2-9.

Jesus on the Mount of Transfiguration with Moses and Elijah present is a heavenly moment as Jesus and his disciples make their way to Jerusalem, Golgotha, and the empty tomb. And, perhaps, that is what is so valuable and instructive about it. Jesus is headed to rejection, persecution, and a painful and shameful death. In our daily life as sojourners on earth and followers of Jesus, we, too know suffering of various kinds. We need-yes, perhaps even Jesus needed—a reminder that the road of life leads not just to suffering and death but to the fulfillment of God's promise of life and salvation. The heavenly voice that spoke at Jesus' baptism speaks again about Jesus as God's Beloved Son. What is added here is the critical admonition to listen to Jesus. In both Hebrew and Greek, to listen conveys the element of obedience. You listen to the one you are willing to obey, and the one you obey you hear with full attention. As we follow our crucified Lord through life, let us pay attention, listen closely, and seek faithful obedience to Jesus, the one who bestows on us God's heavenly glory. How do vou listen closelv to Jesus?

Pray: Almighty and everlasting God, may we see glimpses of your glory that day by day we may listen and obey our Lord Jesus Christ with faith and confidence. Amen.

SERVICE

In 2 Kings 2:1-12 God passes Elijah's mantle to Elisha. In the Bible God routinely passes on leadership from one person to another, like Abraham to Isaac, Jacob to Joseph, Moses to Joshua, and Elijah to Elisha. Who is someone you can encourage and support as a leader and servant of God this week?

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS

This is Transfiguration Sunday. Jesus' clothes became dazzling white. This was an amazing experience for the disciples. Think or talk about experiences you have had where you felt close to God. They are sacred moments. Spend time this week reading the Bible and reflecting on God's word. If you have children, use a children's storybook Bible.

CHILDREN'S MOMENT

Today I want to talk about my glasses. For the longest time I only needed glasses to read books and computer screens, but a few years ago, I discovered that I need to wear glasses all the time in order that the world around me will not be fuzzy. I need to wear glasses so I can see clearly.

In today's New Testament lesson, we will hear the story of the Transfiguration of Jesus. Transfiguration means change—Jesus' appearance changed before three disciples, changing the way that they saw him.

One night, Jesus took Peter, James and John up a mountain to pray. I need to be clear: Jesus was praying, but his disciples (Jesus' closest friends) fell asleep. When the three men woke up, they saw that Jesus was changed: he was wearing white and bright light shone around him. What's more, the Old Testament prophets, Elijah and Moses, appeared near Jesus and were talking to Jesus! Peter, James and John were so entranced by what they saw that Peter offered to build three houses (or dwellings, or tents—depending on your translation) for Jesus, Moses and Elijah. But then something even more astonishing happened: God's voice from a cloud began to speak to the disciples, saying, "This is my Son, my Chosen: listen to him!" God was making sure that the disciples understood who Jesus was—God's chosen Son.

Christians call what happened on the mountain that night the Transfiguration. For Jesus' disciples, that night was like putting on prescription glasses—they were finally able to see who Jesus was: the Son of God.

Beginning this Wednesday, we will enter the season of Lent—40 days to put on our spiritual glasses to get to know Jesus better. I encourage you to take time in the days and weeks to come to dig deeply into the Bible. Plunge deeply into prayer. Offer yourself completely to those in need. Spend Lent getting to know Jesus by reflecting his light and his love in our community, our nation and our world. Amen.

Open us to your light that we might hear your voice from the heavens and in our hearts—whispering to us words of challenge, words of comfort, words that rock our world and rock us to sleep. Open us to your silent song. SILENCE

Holy God, We open our ears and we hear your voice, 'This is my beloved Son, listen to him!' And we give you thanks.

All of this we pray with the prayer your son taught us to pray...

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our debts as we forgive our debtors. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever. Amen.

NEW TESTAMENT LESSON: Matthew 17:1-23 (NRSV)

Six days later, Jesus took with him Peter and James and his brother John and led them up a high mountain, by themselves. ² And he was transfigured before them, and his face shone like the sun, and his clothes became dazzling white. ³ Suddenly there appeared to them Moses and Elijah, talking with him. ⁴ Then Peter said to Jesus, "Lord, it is good for us to be here; if you wish, I will make three dwellings here, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah."⁵ While he was still speaking, suddenly a bright cloud overshadowed them, and from the cloud a voice said, "This is my Son, the Beloved; with him I am well pleased; listen to him!"⁶ When the disciples heard this, they fell to the ground and were overcome by fear. ⁷ But Jesus came and touched them, saying, "Get up and do not be afraid."⁸ And when they looked up, they saw no one except Jesus himself alone.

⁹ As they were coming down the mountain, Jesus ordered them, "Tell no one about the vision until after the Son of Man has been raised from the dead." ¹⁰ And the disciples asked him, "Why, then, do the scribes say that Elijah must come first?" ¹¹ He replied, "Elijah is indeed coming and will restore all things; ¹² but I tell you that Elijah has already come, and they did not recognize him, but they did to him whatever they pleased. So also the Son of Man is about to suffer at their hands." ¹³ Then the disciples understood that he was speaking to them about John the Baptist.

¹⁴ When they came to the crowd, a man came to him, knelt before him, ¹⁵ and said, "Lord, have mercy on my son, for he is an epileptic and he suffers terribly; he often falls into the fire and often into the water. ¹⁶ And I brought him to your disciples, but they could not cure him." ¹⁷ Jesus answered, "You faithless and perverse generation, how much longer must I be with you? How much longer must I put up with you? Bring him here to me." ¹⁸ And Jesus rebuked the demon, and it came out of him, and the boy was cured instantly. ¹⁹ Then the disciples came to Jesus privately and said, "Why could we not cast it out?" ²⁰ He said to them, "Because of your little faith. For truly I tell you, if you have faith the size of a mustard seed, you will say to this mountain, 'Move from here to there,' and it will move; and nothing will be impossible for you."

²² As they were gathering in Galilee, Jesus said to them, "The Son of Man is going to be betrayed into human hands, ²³ and they will kill him, and on the third day he will be raised." And they were greatly distressed.

SERMON

Today is Transfiguration Sunday—the last Sunday before Lent, which begins on Wednesday with Ash Wednesday's imposition of ashes. Today is an in-between day in the life of the church. Epiphany is over, but Lent has not begun. Transfiguration Sunday interrupts our worship, calling us to the mountaintop that we might see Jesus in new ways.

When I first read through today's scripture lesson, I was struck by the words "still speaking" lodged within the text. A phrase used within the United Church of Christ, reminds us that God is still speaking to us—offering us welcome, word and wisdom for us today. The "Still Speaking" movement is important because God's isn't offered long ago alone. God has a new word to speak to us right here and right now. That God is "Still Speaking" provides both comfort and challenge in these months of pandemic, political upheaval and stress.

But what is wild about today's gospel lesson is that the phrase "Still Speaking" is NOT about God's words, but Peter's! We hear that while Peter was **still speaking** to Jesus, completely dazzled by Christ's transfiguration and the appearance of Moses and Elijah, **God interrupts** the conversation! On Transfiguration Sunday, we are like Peter—still speaking our dazzled and often empty words of praise when we are interrupted by God's holy whispered, shouted, and sung voice from the mountaintop.

Truly, isn't that the way God works? We might be going about our daily business—in worship, work, school, home, when suddenly we are jolted awake by God's voice, God's call. Our lives are interrupted and we are stopped short. Whether through tragedy or joy, our lives are interrupted while we are still speaking by God who loves us and calls us and challenges us to know Christ fully, that we might live as Jesus' disciples, Jesus' followers.

Indeed, Transfiguration Sunday is an interruption in and of itself. It is the jolt to our senses and sensibilities between Epiphany and Lent. On this day, we are reminded that Jesus has moved out of infanthood and childhood to become the man who teaches and heals, who loves and forgives—and who ultimately walks the way of suffering, the way of the cross.

God's interrupting words are telling: "This is my Son, my Chosen; listen to him!" Apart from the final phrase, "Listen to him," these words are an exact echo of the divine voice at Jesus' baptism. At the Transfiguration, not only is God claiming Jesus as his own, God also commands us to listen—even when Jesus' words are difficult and confusing.

Sometimes listening—really listening—is the best gift we can offer to God. How often do we take time to allow silence, stillness, and serenity into our lives that we might hear the voice of the holy, the word of God? Just as we give our friends and family our listening ears, God also asks that we listen to Jesus & that we listen for that divine Spirit which sparks joy and hope in our lives.

On Transfiguration Sunday, Christ becomes transformed before our very eyes when we set aside our preconceived notions of the Baby Jesus, the Epiphany Magi, the Healer, Miracle Worker, Friend and FULLY LISTEN to Jesus' word for each of us.

So, what does this mean for us today? How do we take the message of Transfiguration Sunday forward into Lent, Easter, and beyond? How do we live as disciples of Christ, joining Peter, James, and John on the high mountain? Perhaps, we begin by noticing the interruptions that catch us short and slow us down. Author, poet, and mystic Annie Dillard speaks of church as a place in which interruptions and surprises should be so prevalent that we should "all be wearing crash helmets...and the ushers should issue life preservers and signal flares...for God may draw us out to where we can never return."

Maybe it is the imagery of crash helmets and life preservers that have us uneasy—even fearful—about change in our lives. When we are called to change, we are often filled with anxiety and fear. This past year has been a perfect example of this: the pandemic has disrupted our way of life and many of us have responded with fear and anxiety.

As St. Paul Church, as this particular gathered Body of Christ, we are called to listen carefully for God's interruptions and not to be afraid of the changes that threaten to seemingly rock our world. Because this we know: Jesus is in charge and Jesus calls us to choose love again and again and again.

Our New Testament Lesson does not end with Jesus and his disciples on the mountaintop. They came down from their vision of glory and right into the work of ministry. In this case, it is the healing of a child with epilepsy.

This is a reminder that no matter our mountain top experiences, no matter how God interrupts our daily lives, we are still called to minister to others down in the valley, in the streets of New Bremen, on the corners of downtown Cincinnati and in the courtyards of El Salvador. We might want to stay on the mountaintop, capturing the moment by building dwellings, but we cannot, we must not. Jesus sends us down the mountain and into the messiness of daily living—especially in these uncertain times.

Friends: Be not afraid! On this Sunday in which we pivot between Epiphany and Lent, in this season of upheaval and Transfiguration, know this: Jesus loves you beyond measure. He shows you exactly who he is: God's Chosen Son. And then he sends you out to share God's love today and in all our days to come. Amen. WE RESPOND WITH OUR GIFTS

OFFERING INVITATION: When Jesus was transfigured before Peter, James and John, their lives changed forever. When we experience the Light of Christ in our own lives, we are never the same. Today we offer to God our very best: our lives, our talents, our time and our treasure for the building up of God's Kingdom on earth as it is in heaven. Let us give generously and joyfully. Amen.


