Dear St. Paul Church Family and Friends,

Grace and Peace to you in the name of Jesus Christ, our Savior and Friend.

Throughout Lent at St. Paul, we are focusing on Jesus as our Healer. Almost a year into the global pandemic, our worship centers upon seeking healing of physical, mental and spiritual ailments.

The Worship Team met vesterday to make decisions about Holy Week worship services. This is what we decided:

March 28. Palm Sunday/Rite of Confirmation at 10:15 in the sanctuary and via Facebook Live. Sunday School children will process with palms at the start of the service.

April 1. Maundy Thursday Healing Service at 6:30 in the sanctuary and via Facebook Live. Service will include prayers, scripture, sermon, Prayers of Healing, Sacrament of Holy Communion and lighting of candles for healing.

April 2. Good Friday Tenebrae Service at 6:30 in the sanctuary and via Facebook Live. Service will include music, scriptures and candlelight slowly diminishing until only the Christ Candle is lit.

April 4. Easter Sunday! Worship will be held in the sanctuary and via Facebook Live at 7:30, 9:00 and 10:30 a.m. Service will include music, prayers, scriptures, preaching and the Sacrament of Holy Communion.

Worship Team also made the decision to wait until at least September before restarting the Saturday evening service.

Daily Devotions have been scaled back slightly. Pastor Becky now leads them Monday-Thursday only at 11:30 via Facebook Live. Pastor Becky takes Fridays as her Sabbath day.

Our Blessing Pantry is staffed by volunteers on Tuesday evenings from 5:30-7:30. The Pantry is also open Wednesday and Thursday afternoons from 1:00-3:00 p.m. We are currently in need of plastic grocery bags. Donated bags can be dropped off at the church office

or left in barrels located on the north and east entry doors to the education building.

Thank you for your faithfulness to St. Paul Church! Together we are the Body of Christ in this community.

#### CARING CONVERSATIONS

Discuss in your home, small group, or use for personal reflections:

- Talk or think about something you really love to do.
- How do you show love for others?
- God created the whole world and loves it. What does that say about the kind of God we have?



Read: John 3:14-21.

These words from Jesus are part of a conversation he is having with Nicodemus who had come to see Jesus by night. There is a contrast here between those who love the darkness (initially Nicodemus) and those who "come to the light" (v. 21). Nicodemus would eventually be drawn to the light by defending Jesus in front of the Pharisees (John 7:51-52) and preparing Jesus' body after his crucifixion (John 19:39). In the Gospel of John, following and believing in Jesus can be a journey of coming to the light and gaining eternal life, as Nicodemus does. Darkness cannot choose light; it must be overcome by the light. The judgement of which Jesus speaks is remaining in the dark. Eternal life is having the light of Christ overcome the darkness that prevents us from seeing and loving Jesus. How has the light of Christ helped you in challenging times or times of darkness?

*Pray:* Merciful God, we thank you for your love for us that calls us out of darkness and to the light of Christ that we may not perish but have eternal life. Amen.

# SERVICE


Numbers 21:4-9 records that God sent snakes among the people of Israel to punish them. But after Moses prayed for the people, God directed Moses to make a bronze snake and put it up on a pole. When anyone who had been bitten looked at the snake, they were healed. The symbol of a snake on a pole is associated with medicine and health care. This week, plan an act of thanks and appreciation for a doctor, nurse, or medical worker in your community.

# CHILDREN'S MOMENT

Beach glass begins as something whole and yet discarded. As it is tumbled by the ocean, it is broken and polished until it becomes a smooth thing of beauty. Throughout Lent this year, we will look to beach glass as a metaphor for the healing that is needed in our lives: physical, emotional, spiritual healing. What began as a broken and discarded piece of glass is transformed by the waves of the ocean. What begins as brokenness in our own lives is polished and made smooth by God's love. Poet Bernadette Noll writes this:

I want to age like sea glass. Smoothed by tides, but not broken. I want my hard edges to soften. I want to ride the waves and go with the flow. I want to catch a wave and let it carry me to where I belong. I want to be picked up and held gently by those who delight in my well earned patina and appreciate the changes I went through to achieve that beauty. I want to enjoy the journey and always remember that if you give the ocean something breakable it will turn it into something beautiful. I want to age like sea glass.

Throughout Lent, we will look to sea glass, to beach glass, as we seek healing in our lives. Each week we will add a bead of beach glass to a bracelet—a bracelet that grows each week with an added bead, an added reminder that God takes our lives, heals us, and transforms us into something beautiful. Today we begin by putting a yellow glass bead onto our bracelets. Yellow is the brightest of colors—the color we associate with the brightness of the sun. Yellow symbolizes optimism, energy, joy, happiness and friendship. By adding a yellow bead to your bracelet, you are choosing joy over sorrow, friendship over enmity, optimism over pessimism. In these months of illness, racial unrest and uncertainty, yellow stands as a beacon of hope.

This week I encourage you to wear your bracelet with its green, blue, grey and yellow beads of healing. Every time you look at your wrist, every time you touch the beads, know this: you are treasured by God. God keeps and holds your life. You belong. Amen.


### Kaitlyn Tontrup
