Dear St. Paul Church Family and Friends,

Grace and Peace to you in the name of Jesus Christ, our Savior and Friend.

This worship packet includes bulletins for Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday and Good Friday. You will receive your Easter bulletin next week.

March 28. Palm Sunday/Rite of Confirmation at 10:15 in the sanctuary and via Facebook Live. Sunday School children will process with palms at the start of the service.

April 1. Maundy Thursday Healing Service from 6:30-7:30 in the sanctuary and via Facebook Live. Service will include prayers, scripture, sermon, Prayers of Healing, Sacrament of Holy Communion and lighting of candles for healing.

April 2. Good Friday Tenebrae Service from 6:30-7:30 in the sanctuary and via Facebook Live. Service will include music, scriptures and candlelight slowly diminishing until only the Christ Candle is lit.

April 4. Easter Sunday! Worship services will be held in the sanctuary at 7:30. 9:00 and 10:30 a.m. We will also offer Easter worship via Facebook Live at 9:00 a.m. Services will include music, prayers, scriptures, preaching and the Sacrament of Holy Communion.

As a gentle reminder, we ask that if you plan to worship in the sanctuary, please remain masked for the duration of the service in order that we might keep each other safe. Thank you.

On the back of this letter, you will find an outline of a palm branch. You are invited to color it, cut it out, and wave it during the processional hymn this Sunday if you are worshipping at home.

Daily Devotions have been scaled back slightly. Pastor Becky now leads them Monday-Thursday only at 11:30 via Facebook Live. Pastor Becky takes Fridays as her Sabbath day. When Becky takes sabbatical time in mid-April to early May, Daily Devotions will be on hold until she returns.

St. Paul Church will host a Rummage Sale on April 16 and 17. Donations of your household items can begin to arrive and be placed in front of the stage in the auditorium beginning Tuesday April 6. All proceeds will go to the Project of the Year: The Blessing Pantry.

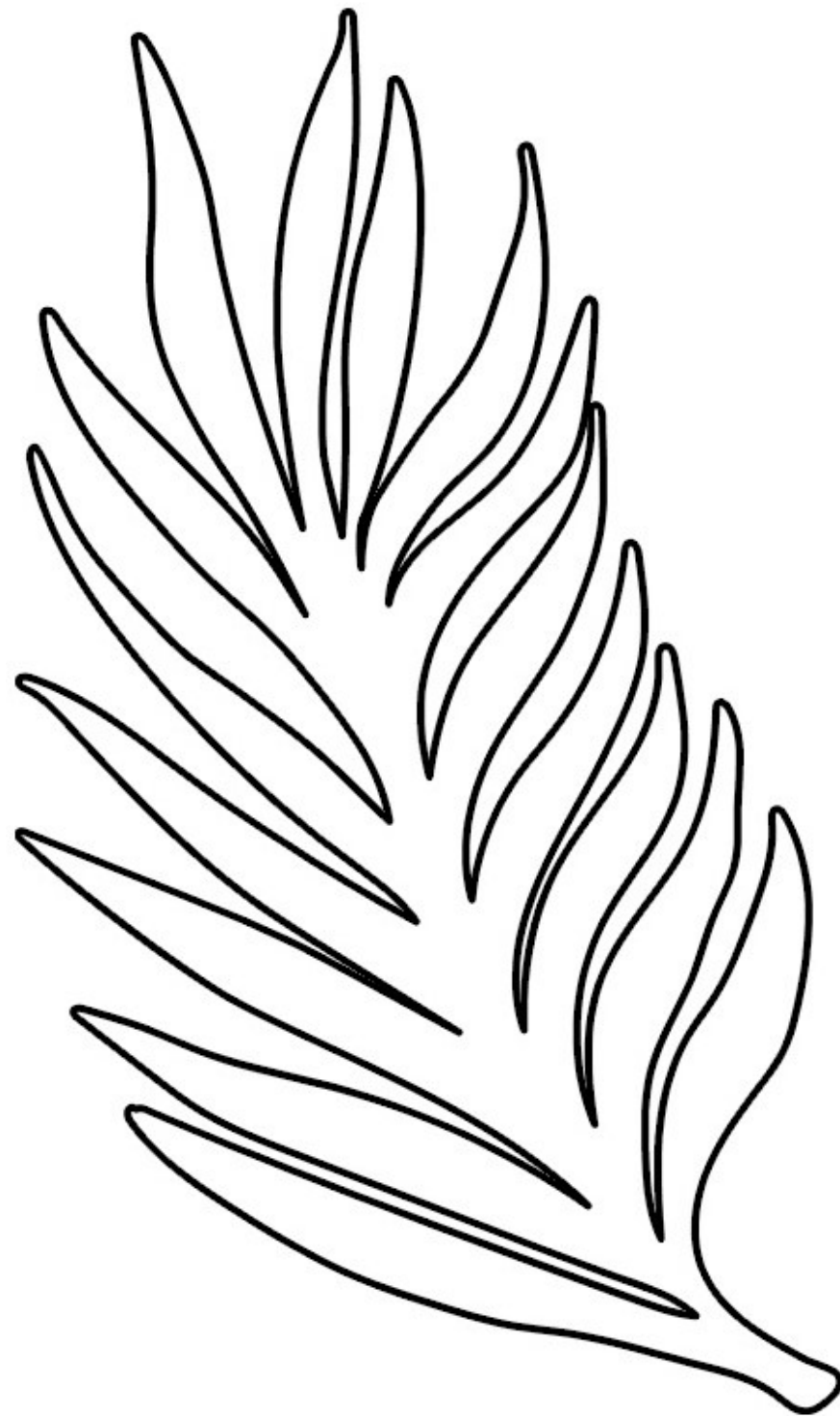
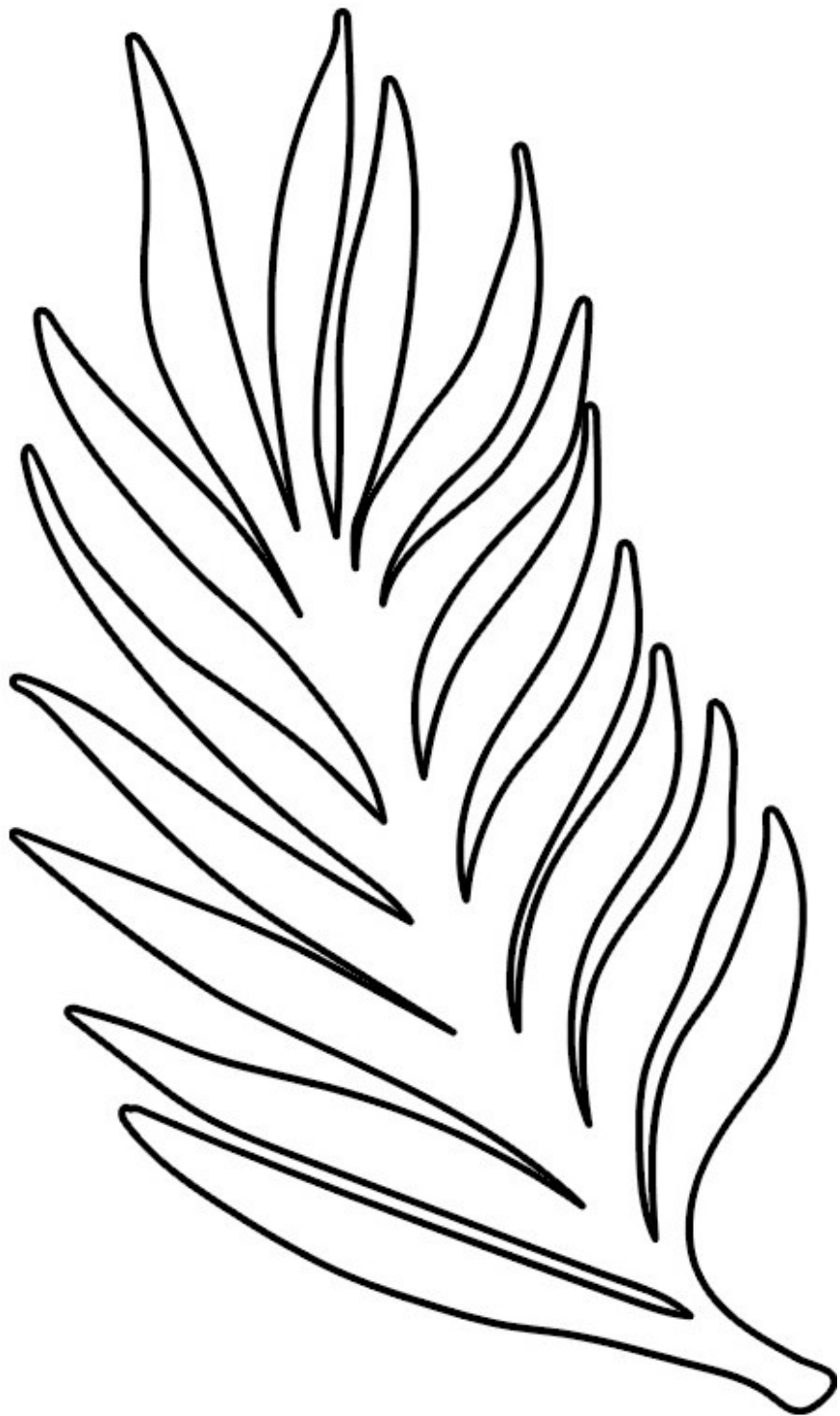

NEW TESTAMENT LESSON: Mark 11:1-11 (NRSV)

When they were approaching Jerusalem, at Bethphage and Bethany, near the Mount of Olives, he sent two of his disciples² and said to them, "Go into the village ahead of you, and immediately as you enter it, you will find tied there a colt that has never been ridden; untie it and bring it."³ If anyone says to you, "Why are you doing this?" just say this, "The Lord needs it and will send it back here immediately."⁴ They went away and found a colt tied near a door, outside in the street. As they were untying it,⁵ some of the bystanders said to them, "What are you doing, untying the colt?"⁶ They told them what Jesus had said; and they allowed them to take it.⁷ Then they brought the colt to Jesus and threw their cloaks on it; and he sat on it.⁸ Many people spread their cloaks on the road, and others spread leafy branches that they had cut in the

fields. ⁹ Then those who went ahead and those who followed were shouting,

“Hosanna!

Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord!
¹⁰ *Blessed is the coming kingdom of our ancestor David!*
