DEVOTIONS



Read: John 15:9-17.

This passage intimately connects a relationship of Jesus and "the Father" with Jesus' own followers. The relationship is woven together through the language of commandments and love, and the two are brought together in verse 12: "This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you." The Gospel of John does not have the "Great Commandment" dialog as in Matthew, Mark, and Luke. However, the theme here is the same: love God and love neighbor. The emphasis in John is that love is the way to have an enduring relationship with God and with brothers and sisters in the faith, those whom Jesus calls "friends." The word for friends in Greek is "loved ones." Love—not judgment and ridicule—is how Jesus relates to us. It is how we, as Jesus' friends, are to approach the world so that our joy may be complete. How does love change our relationship with others? How does a commitment to love others change us?

Pray: Loving God, we thank you for showing us the depth of your love for us through the life, death, resurrection, and ascension of your Son and our Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.

SERVICE



In the Bible, love is more than an emotion. Love is a commitment to care for others with our whole being. Conflict can get in the way of this love. Bringing God into our conflicted relationships can be a difference maker. This week think of those you have a conflict or tensions with, and pray to God for a clean and loving heart to reconcile your relationships.

The theme this week is "Love one another." May 9 is observed as Mother's Day in the United States. Reflect on the women in your life who have loved and cared for you. Think or talk about what you learned from them and how you show love to others. Pray: Dear God, thank you for your love. Thank you for [name women who have cared for you]. PRESCHOOL/KINDERGARTEN CLASS PRESENTATION

SCRIPTURE LESSON: John 21:1-17 (New Living Translation)

Later, Jesus appeared again to the disciples beside the Sea of Galilee. This is how it happened. ² Several of the disciples were there—Simon Peter, Thomas (nicknamed the Twin), Nathanael from Cana in Galilee, the sons of Zebedee, and two other disciples.

³ Simon Peter said, "I'm going fishing."

"We'll come, too," they all said. So they went out in the boat, but they caught nothing all night.

⁴ At dawn Jesus was standing on the beach, but the disciples couldn't see who he was. ⁵ He called out, "Fellows, have you caught any fish?" "No," they replied.

⁶ Then he said, "Throw out your net on the right-hand side of the boat, and you'll get some!" So they did, and they couldn't haul in the net because there were so many fish in it.

⁷ Then the disciple Jesus loved said to Peter, "It's the Lord!" When Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he put on his tunic (for he had stripped for work), jumped into the water, and headed to shore. ⁸ The others stayed with the boat and pulled the loaded net to the shore, for they were only about a hundred yards from shore. ⁹ When they got there, they found breakfast waiting for them—fish cooking over a charcoal fire, and some bread.

¹⁰ "Bring some of the fish you've just caught," Jesus said. ¹¹ So Simon Peter went aboard and dragged the net to the shore. There were 153 large fish, and yet the net hadn't torn.

¹² "Now come and have some breakfast!" Jesus said. None of the disciples dared to ask him, "Who are you?" They knew it was the Lord. ¹³ Then Jesus served them the bread and the fish. ¹⁴ This was the

third time Jesus had appeared to his disciples since he had been raised from the dead.

¹⁵ After breakfast Jesus asked Simon Peter, "Simon son of John, do you love me more than these?"

"Yes, Lord," Peter replied, "you know I love you."

"Then feed my lambs," Jesus told him.

¹⁶ Jesus repeated the question: "Simon son of John, do you love me?"

"Yes, Lord," Peter said, "you know I love you."

"Then take care of my sheep," Jesus said.

¹⁷ A third time he asked him, "Simon son of John, do you love me?" Peter was hurt that Jesus asked the question a third time. He said, "Lord, you know everything. You know that I love you." Jesus said, "Then feed my sheep.

RESPONSE

Leader: The word of God for the people of God!

People: God is still speaking! Thanks be to God!

MEDITATION

Six weeks into the Easter season and we are still rejoicing. We've laughed, we've sung, we've committed ourselves to being the Body of Christ in this community and the surrounding area. We are Jesus People. We are Easter People. We are on-fire for Jesus.

Except when we are not. If the truth were told, there are some days (even some seasons!) in which we struggle to be a follower of Jesus. Sometimes it seems as if our faith is just, **just** out of our grasp. Sometimes we wonder what the resurrection of Jesus might mean for our lives.

Friends, the good news is this: we are not alone. Rev. Becky had a seminary professor who used to call the disciples the Duh-Sciples because over and over again in our gospels, they never seemed to fully grasp who Jesus was. And Simon Peter was no exception.

Before Jesus' arrest, trial and death, Peter wavered between belief and unbelief. On the night of Jesus' arrest, Peter denied his connection to Jesus three (three!) times. And yet, Jesus promised that upon this incredibly fallible disciple, the church would take root and grow.

Today's gospel lesson picks up after Easter. Jesus has risen from the dead. His disciples rejoiced and yet (and yet!) they still didn't know what to do next. So what did they do? They went back to doing that which they knew best: fishing.

What's interesting about this story is that we read that these seasoned fishermen caught nothing at all. As they were heading back to shore, their nets empty, they saw a man standing on the beach, calling out to them. Again, what is interesting is that the disciples, Jesus' closest friends, still did not recognize their Lord.

Jesus called out for the men to throw their nets on the right side of the boat. The men did as instructed and caught a haul of so many fish they could not drag their laden nets into the boat. It is about this time that Simon Peter realized that the man on the beach was Jesus. Completely flustered, he dove into the water and swam to shore.

What Peter found on the beach was Jesus cooking breakfast for his friends. It was at this moment that things took an interesting turn. Remember: on the night of Jesus' arrest, Peter had denied knowing Jesus three times. Three. Now, while Jesus, Peter and the other disciples were eating breakfast, Jesus asked Simon Peter THREE times: Do you love me?

At times, forgiveness comes in the form of questions asked, "Do you love me?" And each of those three times, Peter answered, "Yes." And each time, Jesus gave Peter his lifelong marching order: feed and care for my sheep.

And that is exactly what Peter did for the rest of his life.

And what of us? Despite the joy of Easter, this past year has been hard. Really hard. Despite the joy of Easter, we might find ourselves wanting to walk away from this resurrection life and go back to the familiar: in the case of the disciples—to go back to their fishing boats.

And yet, Jesus seeks us out no matter which way we turned, wandered, or gotten lost. The risen Christ shows up in our lives when we least expect him—knocking us off our feet and filling our boats with fish.

That, my friends, is good news indeed! We want to be Easter People—to be bathed in resurrection's glory every moment of our lives,

but we get off-track so easily. We build walls against one another. We close our minds to new ideas. We refuse to reach out a helping hand to those in need. We deny hospitality to the stranger. We hurt, with what we say and what we left unsaid, those in our closest circles of love.

Perhaps the most powerful lesson of the Easter Season is one of forgiveness. Christ Jesus forgives us—again and again and again. Therefore, we are called to forgive one another. Again and again and again.

Poet and theologian Ann Weems has written a beautiful poem about today's scripture lesson:

He said, "Feed my sheep."

There were no conditions:

Least of all, Feed my sheep if they deserve it.

Feed my sheep if you feel like it.

Feed my sheep if you have any leftovers.

Feed my sheep if the mood strikes you

If the economy's ok...

If you are not too busy...

No conditions...just, "Feed my sheep."
Could it be that God's Kingdom will come when each lamb is fed?
We who have agreed to keep covenant are called to feed sheep even when it means the grazing will be done on our own front lawns.

So, my dear ones, let us get out of the boat and share a meal with Christ Jesus who forgives us and feeds us abundantly. Let us get out of the boat and go into the highways and byways of life—reaching out to those in need. Let us get out of the boat and follow Jesus. Amen!





One 50 oz. or two 25 oz. bottle(s) of liquid laundry detergent
One 16-28 oz. bottle of liquid disinfectant dish soap
One 12-16 oz. bottle of household cleaner that can be mixed with water
(no spray bottles)
One package of 48-50 clothespins
Clothesline, two 50 ft. or one 100 ft.
Five dust masks
Two pairs heavy-duty, waterproof dishwashing gloves (latex-free, non-
surgical)
One pair work gloves, cotton with leather palm or all leather
24-28 heavy duty or contractor type 30-45 gallon trash bags on a roll and
removed from carton
One 6-9 oz. bottle of non-aerosol insect repellent

All cleaning items must be new— all liquid items must be capped and securely tightened. Place all items into the bucket, making sure they are packed securely to avoid damage during shipment. Snap the lid on tight and seal with packing tape.
