### CARING CONVERSATIONS

Discuss in your home, small group, or use for personal reflections:

- How do you react when you see someone being excluded from a group?
- Jesus showed love even to strangers. How would you describe the way you treat strangers?

### DEVOTIONS

*Read:* Mark 7:24-37.

Jesus shows uncharacteristic rejection of someone in need. The Syrophenian woman asks for help, but she is not Jewish. She is a foreigner, and Jesus suggests he came for the children of Israel, not those outside of Judea and Galilee. However, perhaps he is speaking the voice of the early church that is likewise wondering what are the proper boundaries for the mission field of the church. The answer: Gentiles—therefore, all people—are part of God's arena of care and redemption through Christ. It is time for all ears, tongues, and hearts to be opened. God's power of love and forgiveness is so awesome that it knows no boundaries. Thanks be to God! God's compassion is present for all of us, stranger and friend alike. When have you reached out to a stranger with the love of God?

*Pray:* **Loving God, just as you reach out to us with your grace and forgiveness, give us hearts to reach out to others that all may know your care through Christ Jesus. Amen.**

### SERVICE


James 2 warns against worshipping communities showing partiality. Many congregations look very homogeneous. They attract people who look, act, and think like one another. Some of this is due to local contexts, but some of it is due to a lack of warmth and initiative taken toward new people. Who is someone who could use your warmth and care to help them feel welcome in your congregation?

## TIME FOR THE CHILD WITHIN US

I've been thinking about how babies are cared for by their parents. Parents make sure tiny babies are fed, diapers changed, cuddled, sung to, and, in the best-case scenario, lavished with love.

It's much the same in the animal world. When elephants are born, they are almost completely blind and are dependent upon their mothers and the other female elephants in the herd to care for them. Years ago, I visited an elephant orphanage in Kenya—baby elephants who'd been taken in when their parents had died.

This is what you need to know about baby elephants. They are social creatures that NEED cuddles and love. So what happens at an elephant orphanage? A human caretaker is assigned to each baby—that person feeds the baby, bathes the baby and even sleeps with the baby each and every night. Just like human babies.

In a few minutes Sam Simon is going to preach a sermon—and in his message you will hear about how incredibly important family is to him.

Families ARE so incredibly important—especially for children. And we also know this—it truly does take a village to raise our children. We look out for one another. We step in when we see a need. We might quietly cover some expenses for a family who is struggling. Even if we have no children of our own, we often find ourselves keeping an eye on the kids in our neighborhood.

Today's scripture lesson is from 1 John chapter 2. If we were to look one chapter further, we would hear over and over again that WE are God's children. God's love for us is like the best and deepest kind of love a mother or a father has for their children.

Friends: you are beloved and precious children of God. Your task this week is to treat everyone you interact with as the precious child they are.

SERMON

Sam Simon with Rev. Becky Erb Strang

When Abby Bushman asked Sam to provide special music with his guitar earlier this summer, he indicated that he also wanted to speak to the congregation. Sam grew up at St. Paul Church, has been an adult leader of the youth group for several years and is passionate about his faith and his family.

Today's sermon will be in a Question/Answer format—I'll ask the questions and Sam will answer. Listen to him well. He has good news to share with us.

Sam, tell us about how you came to love God and love St. Paul Church.

**My grandpa was in the choir at church. He did so much for our family. He was always trying to improve our lives to make sure things would be okay for us.**

Sam, how is your life going?

**I feel happy because my aunts do a lot for me, my mom and my sister. I love music. I love Christian rap music.**

**I like to help people. I help my roommate's family with their cows. Don't get mad at people. Stick up to bullies.**

Sam, where do you work?

**I work at PawPur's Place. I love dogs. I love to care for dogs. Someday I want to get my own dog. If I ever get a dog, I won't need a roommate.**

Sam, what do you believe about God?

**God has done a lot for us. God opened my eyes about who I care about, who I love and who I am.**

Sam, what have you learned from your dad?

**My dad taught me a lot of things—especially about money.**

Sam, what have you learned from your mom?

**My mom taught me how to grow up and take responsibility. I love my mom.**

Sam, tell us what you believe about prayer.

**I pray for my dad to get better. I pray for my family: my mom, sister, aunts, nephews. They opened my eyes and my heart to make my life happy.**

Sam, where do you see your life in a few years?

**I want to open a business. I want to take photos for scrapbooks. I want to travel the world. I want to see different things. I love to go places.**

What words of hope do you have for us?

**Think about your family. Take care of yourself. Think about your actions. Be careful about what you say.**

**One person can call you a name. Don't respond. Walk away.**

**I don't want to be negative.**

Friends, did you hear what Sam had to say to us today?

Think before you speak or act.

Take care of yourself.

Love your family.

Pray for others.

When Sam and I first met to plan today's sermon, twice he said, "My eyes and my heart have been opened."

So I ask you today: Are your eyes open to what is happening around you? Is your heart open to love others? Are you dreaming big dreams? Are you including God in your dreams?

Perhaps that is what Sam Simon is telling us: Love yourself. Love your family. Love others. Love God. Do that, and you will know joy.

I close with a poem written by twentieth century poet e e cummings:

*i thank You God for most this amazing  
day:for the leaping greenly spirits of trees  
and a blue true dream of sky;and for everything  
which is natural which is infinite which is yes  
(i who have died am alive again today,  
and this is the sun's birthday;this is the birth  
day of life and of love and wings:and of the gay

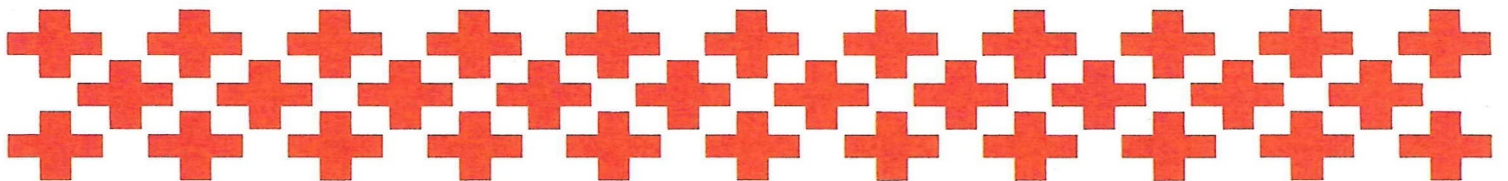
