Lent 2024: Gethsemane to Golgotha

To observe the traditional season of Lent this year, we are introducing a church-wide teaching and activity series entitled Gethsemane to Golgotha. This series will take us through 14 specific Biblical interactions and incidents that Jesus went through on His way to the Cross. The Scriptures describing these 14 events and scenes will provide the content for each of the messages from Ash Wednesday through Good Friday, giving us the opportunity to walk alongside Jesus in a very detailed description of His experience during Passion Week.

To further dig into these important events, each week during Sunday School, Immanuel's youth and children will work to create a series of silhouette tableaus which will become the foundation for our worship service on Good Friday. The events and Scriptures of the series are:

- 1 Jesus in the Gethsemane garden Matthew 26:36-46
- 2 Jesus is betrayed and arrested Luke 22:47-53
- 3 Jesus is condemned by the Sanhedrin Mark 14:53-65
- 4 Jesus is denied by Peter Matthew 26:69-75
- 5 Jesus is judged by Pilate John 18:28-38
- 6 Jesus is scourged and crowned with thorns Mark 15:16-20
- 7 Jesus bears the cross John 19:6, 15-17
- 8 Jesus is helped by Simon of Cyrene Mark 15:21
- 9 Jesus meets the women of Jerusalem Luke 23:27-31
- 10 Jesus is crucified Matthew 27:33-34
- 11 Jesus promises His kingdom to the good thief Luke 23:32-43
- 12 Jesus speaks to His mother and the disciple John 19:25-27
- 13 Jesus dies on the cross Mark 15:33-41
- 14 Jesus is placed in the tomb Matthew 27:57-60



It is our hope and prayer that this Lenten study and activities will help all the members and friends of Immanuel Church to understand and observe the season of Lent and remember the love and sacrifice that Jesus made to bring us into God's eternal family. 


OPPORUNITY for SERVICE at IMMANUEL – IT TAKES ALL and ALL IT TAKES!

A Mission/Purpose Statement resulting from Global Focus workshops emphasizing Immanuel's theme of **GO FURTHER** has been approved which is: Immanuel Church of Spring seeks to glorify God, preach the gospel of Jesus across the street and across the globe and welcome all into biblical Christian community.


