## APRIL MISSION PARTNER

For April mission partner, the Mission Team selected **FAMILY PROMISE OF MONTGOMERY COUNTY** headed by Champion Jean Rutherford. FPMC is a local 90-day Program in partnership with local congregations which focuses on providing shelter, meals, and compassionate assistance for homeless families with children. Their prevention and case management services help families from reaching a crisis mode. In addition, for the week of April 28 to May 4, Family Promise is asking during that time frame to help fill the needs of their guests with meals, fellowship, and overnight assistance. If you have the opportunity to provide any of this care, let Rev. Phil or Jean Rutherford know.

In March, **God's Garage** gift will be reported in May due to distribution time (see more page 6) and Samaritan's Purse boxes were shipped to South Africa and Mexico. Also, in an ongoing effort, there is a basket in the Narthex for **nonperishable food donations for NAM**.


#### OPPORUNITY for SERVICE at IMMANUEL – IT TAKES ALL and ALL IT TAKES!

- KROGER COMMUNITY REWARDS benefit Immanuel simply by you shopping. Every time you shop with the Kroger share card through their Community Rewards program, Kroger donates to Immanuel based on your regular shopping if you link your card to Immanuel and this is how to make that happen:

- Northwest Assistance Ministries (NAM) invites you to join them in helping meet the needs of others. There are lots of regular ongoing opportunities posted in the Parish Hall. Also, a basket is in the Narthex for ongoing monthly food donations to help deprived families with basic nutritional needs.
- Product coupons are collected regularly at Immanuel by Molly and distributed in various areas overseas to benefit the military and their families for use in the commissary.

More help is always welcomed for their various activities and mentors through SISD Vine Program. If your heart directs you to participate in any of these areas, see Janice Yetter for details. In addition, Outreach is making more medical equipment available in case of an emergency.

## **Dedication**

The highlight this month is devoted, hardworking dedication. With the purpose of the Women's Guild being to unite all the Women of the Church in Christian Fellowship with divine guidance in order to promote Christian services and spread the word of the Spiritual Life from the local church to the World, with 54 members in 1967 they began to reach out to other church groups by hosting meeting luncheons and going to Association meetings.

At the local level, their budget had expanded to \$505. By drawing on lessons from their conservative lifestyles, they managed to stretch these meager sources to cover contributions to such areas as: flowers, kitchen supplies, postage, Church World Services, Eden Home, Slumber Falls, Building Fund, Christmas Trees, cleaning supplies, and even added the feature of a babysitter for their meetings. Their monthly calendars were full as well as the weeks in between which were all focused on doing God's work.

Around 1983, during Women's Guild 60<sup>th</sup> year, they were instrumental in starting the church library and added significant financial support to the day care building, repainting of the Parish Hall, repairing pew cushions, and a new furnace just to name a few.

Descendants of these dedicated, hardworking women carry on 2024's version of these traditions and remain true to Immanuel Church of Spring.

To learn more of this time of bonding and camaraderie which continues to exist today, you are invited to their meeting on April 11 when they will host a salad luncheon at 1, be inspired with a devotional from Ginny, and prepare College Boxes. - 3. A Mission/Purpose Statement resulting from Global Focus workshops emphasizing Immanuel's theme of **GO FURTHER** has been approved which is: Immanuel Church of Spring seeks to glorify God, preach the gospel of Jesus across the street and across the globe and welcome all into biblical Christian community.

- 5. Coffee Fellowship continues at 10am before Church Service at 10:45, but there is still an option for after church for special occasions. 

With GOD'S GARAGE being March's mission partner for Immanuel, eight members toured their new facility in Conroe with amazement. While they are known for their mission of matching reliable transportation to women in various walks of life, their impact goes FAR beyond that as they




nurture the body and soul through many avenues such as job training, Crock Pot Cooking where women go home with recipes

and a crock pot, and group share seminars. In fact, their Mission Statement is the Apostles Creed.

Every wall is adorned with positive and inspirational messages and dedicated, as well as knowledgeable, compassionate volunteers log in thousands of hours to put God's guidance into action from Tuesday Tune-up to trash take out. Additional, volunteers are welcomed, but it was suggested God's Garage be contacted first to see where your talents would best fit.

As managers, Justin and Sherri beamed as they shared success stories of this God led organization which covers a 75-mile radius and has a rich history in how they were able to acquire the land. They said donations play a BIG part in keeping things running smoothly and are most welcomed by coordinating with an ONLINE notification at GODSGARAGE.ORG. Gifts can be in the form of a vehicle (even non-repairable ones can be used for parts or other forms can be fixed and sold) or monetary since a fix up takes about a \$1000 to get a car on the road. Other forms of help can come from providing auto parts, client needs, shop needs, and/or volunteering.
