North Carolina native Jonathan and wife Indian native Garima Rider have served as missionaries to India for the past 20 years through YWAM and EA with their three children where they manage and financially support the outreach and retreat center in an effort to continue to be effective among unreached Hindus.

In March, **God's Garage** received \$3145 while April's gift to **Family Promise** will be posted in June. Also, in ongoing care, there is a basket in the Narthex for **nonperishable food donations for NAM** which reached an <u>all-time</u> monthly high of 73 lbs. in April.



The highlight this month focuses on the Women's Guild commitment to mission support which they have given and given generously to from the beginning of their existence and not just local, but to wider missions.

In the 50's when household budgets were especially tight, a special tradition was the Family Thank Offering In-gathering Service. During this time, the women brought in small banks from their homes which reflected yearlong savings to be used for mission projects. This service often was highlighted by the women presenting a dramatization to emphasize their goals, especially that of Church World Service to help provide them the ability to purchase clothing and blankets.

Time and time again these women supported wider church organizations such as Slumber Falls Camp, Back Bay Mission, Evangelical Children's Home, Northwest Assistance Ministries, Habitat for Humanity, goodie bags at hospitals for children, and Eden Home. In fact, in the 80's when Eden Home underwent an expansion project, Guild donated \$3,000 to sponsor one patient's room in honor of Martha Borne who was the beloved wife of a former pastor that put her heart and soul into Guild functions and the beautification of the grounds of Immanuel.

Women's Guild takes pride in their firm foundation of the unity of sisterhood and a single purpose to give gifts of love when love is needed in order to spread the glory of God.

To learn more of this time of bonding and camaraderie which continues to exist today, you are invited to their meeting on May 8 and mark your calendar for their 100th Year Celebration Finale on September 14. WE REMEMBER




Memorial Day took shape amid the backdrop of the U.S. Civil War. Before it ended, women began decorating the graves of fallen soldiers. In 1868, when May 30 was designated as Decoration Day, loved

ones placed flowers on the graves of Union and Confederate soldiers alike.

By 1882, Decoration Day became known as Memorial Day, and soldiers who died in other wars were honored too. Over time, it became a day to remember all loved ones who have died — in war and otherwise. In 1971, Congress declared Memorial Day a national holiday to be observed on the last Monday in May. On Memorial Day, we pause to remember people who made the ultimate sacrifice for their country and for our freedom. We also pray for those who continue serving, especially those in harm's way.
