POLICY SEMINAR UPDATE

Virtually and In Person, Over 700 TRIO Professionals joined the 41st Annual Policy Seminar. TRIO professionals met with over 400 Congressional Offices on Hill Day. Indiana TRIO representatives met with all nine congressional offices and two senate offices. Buschon, Carson, Spartz, and Mrvan all signed on to the TRIO Support letters. Indiana TRIO expresses its gratitude to our team leaders: Melinda Chen, Maceo Rainey, and Nicholas Gray, and our attendees: Dennis Bowling, Ronnell DuBose, Barbara Gunn, Lee Roe, Nick Palmer, Josh VanBibber, Joseph Green, Kristin Noonan, Lyann Neuilieb, and Julia Fererrya. Though in spring of 2021 President Biden proposed and the House of Representatives passed legislation to provide a 41% increase for The Department of Education, which included a \$200.8 million increase for TRIO, the final funding agreement only included a 3.8% increase for the Department of Education. However, this included a \$40 million increase to TRIO. The spending package included new funding for Ukraine military and humanitarian assistance and additional COVID-19 emergency relief.

For the first time in the Seminar's history Secretary, Dr. Miguel Cardona, joined attendees in person to welcome and provide insight on his priorities.

COE also hosted Dr. Michelle Asha Cooper, the Acting Assistant Secretary for Postsecondary Education and Deputy Assistant Secretary for Higher Education Programs in the Office of Postsecondary Education at the U.S. Department of Education. A fierce advocate for racial and experienced practitioner, economic equity, demonstrated leader, and long-standing friend of TRIO, Dr. Cooper is one of the nation's most trusted voices in championing access and success for all students in higher education. She fundamentally believes that educational attainment can improve an individual's life and, in doing so, strengthen families, communities, and the workforce. We look forward to working her closely on issues affecting low-income, firstgeneration and students with disabilities.

COE is asking Members of Congress to support a \$170 million funding increase to allow TRIO to serve 1 million students in FY23.

Taylor would like to share with incoming freshmen this advice: "Never be afraid to lean on your school, services, and leaders while attending college. Had it not been for the support of leaders, teachers, and services such as TRIO, I wouldn't have been successful".
