

SNAKEBITE FIRST AID PROTOCOL

Calm down! Save a life!

- Ensure the area is safe
- Remain calm and calm the victim
- Call for hospital transportation

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- Remove any restricting clothing or jewellery
- Apply a pressure bandage for neurotoxic bites
- If a Pressure Bandage is unavailable, a tourniquet can be applied above the bite site if the responsible snake has been correctly identified as a Black Mamba or a Cape Cobra and you are more than 90 minutes from hospital
- Immobilise the limb

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- Transport to hospital for possible antivenom administration
- Continuously monitor the victim's vital signs
- Should respiratory or cardiac arrest occur initiate CPR

DO NOT:

- Cut or suck on the wound
- Kill or capture the snake for identification purposes
- Apply a tourniquet, unless it is a Black Mamba or Cape Cobra bite
- Amputate the affected body part
