### **REAR PARKING LOT PAVED**

The recent paving of Common Ground's rear parking lot was made possible with funds from the US Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) and funneled through the City of Haverhill's Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program.

The CDBG gives maximum feasible priority to activities which will carry out one of three broad national objectives: (1) benefit low-moderate income persons, (2) aid in the prevention or elimination of slums and blight, or (3) meet other community development needs having a particular urgency. Common Ground, a 501(c)3 non-profit, meets these objectives.

Also, Common Ground's association with the Merrimack Valley Dream Center, and CG's use of their mobile shower and bathroom facilities behind the café, was a key element that made this possible. Additional funds were also provided by the City of Haverhill to pave from Winter Street to just beyond the emergency generator to meet and merge with the rear lot.

Access to the food storage area is now easily accessible by eliminating muddy conditions when unloading CG's truck. It also streamlines the monthly food pantry distribution. On Thursday, October 13<sup>th</sup> work was completed by Petra Paving of Hamstead, N.H. at a substantial savings for Common Ground.

# Rooftop Compressors Add Climate Control to the Second and Third Floors

The compressor units pictured at right, located on the roof above the café, provide the final elements for climate control of Common Ground's second and third floors, a major step to utilizing the spaces for our outreach ministries. The units, funded by the George C. Wadleigh Foundation, Inc. Haverhill, MA, allow us to go forward throughout the seasons as our programs expand to meet the needs of those we serve.



#### **VOLUNTEER PROFILES**

Barry Waugh, born in Lawrence, moved to Haverhill as a teenager. He eventually began frequenting Somebody Cares, New England, a drop-in center/cafe at 125 Winter Street in Haverhill. At that time, Somebody Cares was an outreach of Pastor Marlene Yeo that catered to the homeless and low-income residents of the Acre neighbor-



hood. In 2006 Pastor Yeo asked Barry to take on the role of Café Leader and he readerly accepted. In 2008, Somebody Cares moved its outreach activities to the Mount Washington area of Haverhill, and the café transitioned to the Common Ground Café under the leadership of Pastor Russ Wheeler. Barry was asked to continue in his role and again accepted the challenge. In 2015 when Common Ground moved to its new location at 194 Winter St., Waugh went along too. Barry, who spends seven days a week

at the new café—when asked what his day-to-day challenges were, he responded: "Keeping the peace." When asked about the rewards, without hesitation he said: "Seeing the progress that many have made, and moved on to stable lifestyles."

## **Mobile Health Unit Visits Common Ground**

The Greater Lawrence Mobile Health Unit, aka the Mobile Hospital, visits the parking lot adjacent to Common Ground's Winter Street on Monday, Wednesday and Friday afternoons, 1:00 to 4:00 pm. As a walk-in clinic, it is staffed by a doctor and nurse providing free services and medications



available through the Haverhill Family Health Center, 755 Main Street. All visits are confidential and provided by the Greater Lawrence Family Health Center.

#### **REAR PATIO GETS HOLIDAY USE**

The rear patio was put to good use on Memorial Day, the Fourth of July, Labor Day and Columbus Day by hosting cook-outs prepared by the café for the homeless and low income. The patio also provides shelter from the rain and a place to eat meals and congregate when the café is closed.
