Patient Assistance Program Provision of Free Prescription Medications

Our Patient Assistance Program (PAP) continues to be a major asset in assisting our patients with their health journey. The PAP enables Victory patients to receive all or most of their medications at no charge.

Due to the arduous process of enrollment into the pharmaceutical companies' patient assistance programs, we enroll each Victory patient into these programs on their behalf. Victory continues to provide medication and laboratory work for patients who are positive for Hepatitis C. The PAP removes another barrier for our patients as most adults without health coverage can not afford to fill a drug prescription.

Between the months of January through July 2022, our Patient Assistance program has ordered and provided \$37,926.923.98 worth of medications at no cost to our patients.

Medications are ordered from over 25 pharmaceutical companies' patient assistant programs. Pharmaceutical companies like GSK, Gilead/Theracom, Lilly Cares, Sanofi and Takeda continue to be a vital source for our patients.

A Gift of Life A Life Policy Charitable Gift

A gift of a life policy no longer needed can be made to Victory Health Partners, either pledging to make unrestricted annual gifts to the charity to pay future premiums (if any) or not. The policy and annual gifts would be deductible charitable donations in the year given. If the annual gifts are made in the form of appreciated property (I.e., stock) Victory can sell it and the donor can avoid capital gains tax, effectively reducing the cost of the gift.

On existing or new policies, the charity can be named as a primary beneficiary or secondary beneficiary after a family member with the donor maintaining control which means no current deductions, but a charitable estate tax deduction for proceeds paid to the charity on death. In these cases, the policy beneficiary can be changed as the owner might desire and the charity can't depend on the gift. Secondary beneficiaries take only if the primary predeceases.

If a new policy is purchased for the charity, it can provide a significant legacy at lower cost when you make the charity its owner and beneficiary and you agree to make annual tax deductible gifts to the charity equal to the premiums which it pays. The death proceeds will not be included in the donor's estate.

Finally, a charitable remainder trust can be created to receive policy proceeds at death, with the trust providing income to an individual(s) for a specific term and thereafter the trust assets will pass to the charity. The gift will create an estate tax deduction at the donor's death.



We are a faith-based, non-profit primary care medical practice that offers healthcare for adults 19 - 64 years old who are without health coverage. Through partnerships with the medical community, we also offer specialty care for our patients.

How does a person become a Victory Health patient?

Have no form of private medical insurance

- Not be eligible for full Medicaid, Medicare or VA benefits.
- Be a resident of Mobile or Gulf Coast area (MS & FL).
- Be between the ages of 19 & 64.
- Be a U.S. citizen or a legal resident of the United States.

Have a gross household income of less than four times the Federal Poverty Guidelines

What is the Victory co-pay?

- Primary & Dental: \$35 \$55
- Specialty Visits: \$10 \$55
- Counseling & Prescriptions: \$0
- Xrays & EKGs: \$0
