

# **Pastor Pondering**

Resurrection, resurrection, everywhere! What could be better for the week after Easter than a couple light-hearted resurrection stories.

The first comes from First Church member, Jim Trimble. After a career as an actuary in the insurance industry, followed by a second chapter as the Director of the Actuarial Program at UCONN, Jim and his wife Sue retired to Green Bay, Wisconsin. Why Green Bay, you ask? Because they are HUGE Green Bay Packer fans. They hold season tickets for the storied football franchise, and even shared their tickets for a Monday Night Football game with me and Lourdes a few years ago. We loved the game, and even took a tour of storied Lambeau Field; I remember our tour guide as a lifelong fan who, like Jim and Sue, bled Packers green and gold.

So imagine my delight when I received an email from Jim that begins:

"So why am I in Green Bay? You won't believe this-but it's true - For orientation and training in my new part-time job- as a Green Bay Packers Stadium Tour Guide! I can hardly call that a job! It will be a blast. The funny thing is I asked if I could volunteer as a tour guide- and they said no they don't use volunteers- but after hearing my story they encouraged me to apply! It reminds me of an old Steve Martin line in his stand-up comedy act - "I get paid for doing this!"

Okay, so it's not exactly emerging from a tomb, but thank you, Jim, for reminding us to remain open to life's happy surprises.

The second story is about our dog, River, who in February had knee surgery. Again, not exactly crucifixion on a Roman cross. We learned that she had a luxating patella (a knee cap that slides out of place). It got progressively worse, making her lame in that right, rear leg. The surgery was a success, but required us to closely monitor her rehab, including carrying her up and down stairs, and keeping her on a leash inside so she wouldn't jump up on the furniture, not to mention the cone-of-shame. Again, this clearly falls into the category that is sometimes called, "First World problems," but I confess that by the time Holy Week approached, I was so done lugging River's thirty pounds up and down our stairs a dozen times a day. Well, she has now been set free from her leash, leaps onto the furniture, and bounds up and down the stairs. She is free, and so are we!

Sometimes healing requires some leash and lugging time, but resurrection is everywhere! So cast off your cone-of-shame, leap, bound, and be free!

# A Message from Rev. Kevin Weikel

Everyone loves a good story. Stories are memorable. When someone comments on a sermon of mine, it is typically a story I shared within the sermon that stuck out to them. Stories are memorable because they are relatable, and we can connect them to something we have experienced, or could at least imagine experiencing, in our lives.

Stories are also great teachers because the lessons within a story are transferable to many situations in our lives. Stories are powerful, and we remember stories from childhood because of their power. And it is because of the power of story we use the Godly Play curriculum in Church school.

In the October edition of this monthly Cornerstone newsletter, I wrote about Godly Play. I explained that the Godly Play curriculum uses storytelling, specifically the retelling of Bible stories, to help young people learn, explore, and wonder about God's presence throughout history and in their lives.

In that article, I told the history of Godly Play at First Church, describing how it went from one of our stations in the Church School rotation model before COVID to our weekly curriculum since COVID and how, thanks to Dianne and Jim Szipsky, we now have a dedicated Godly Play room (Room 210).

Our students continue to benefit from weekly Godly Play. Not only can our students recite many of the details of our Bible stories after hearing them in Church School, but they also ask good wondering questions about the stories. Parents report that, out of the blue, kids will share details about a Bible story at home or hear about something and say, "That's like what happened in the story..." Bible stories integrated into the fabric of our children's lives is the goal, and it is beautiful to hear reports that it's happening.

The next step in our church's relationship with the Godly Play curriculum is to make available training for as many folks as possible. And so, this is where you come in - yes, you! I am excited to announce a Godly Play training at First Church with a Godly Play facilitator and trainer on May 18th from 9 am to 4 pm (including lunch and snacks). This training is open to everyone and anyone interested in learning how to be a Godly Play storyteller for our Church School.

If you've ever taught anything at all, which we all have, you know that we learn more about something when we teach it; the same is true for our Bible Stories. You will find that teaching encourages us to learn and wonder, and the spiritual lessons of the Bible stories we tell will naturally pop up in our lives. Even more notable, this Godly Play training will give us the opportunity on Sunday mornings—as many or as few as you'd like—to share these stories with our young people.

I'd invite you to sign up for our Godly Play training and become one of our Godly Play Church School teachers. No matter your age, whether you have kids in Church



#### **Musical Notes**

Happy Eastertide!

We are now able to celebrate the risen Christ – we have gone through the temporary elation of Palm Sunday, the angst of Maundy Thursday and Good Friday, and finally the joy of knowing that Christ rose from the dead. This is what it's all about.

Musically, it was a marathon – many major choir anthems for all three services – extra musicians helping out, much time (weeks, in fact) spent by all the choirs and musicians learning and rehearsing the music, practicing logistics so that everything could go as seamlessly as possible... but it was a joyful and fulfilling process. We contributed music that was particularly meaningful not only to the attending congregation, but to the singers and musicians as well. The saying – no tears in the eyes of the performers - no tears in the eyes of the listeners – holds true here. We must get personally involved with our music – otherwise, it means less. That said, for maximum effectiveness, we have to keep the distractions and missed notes down to as few as possible, and do it as best as we can. For ourselves, the congregation, and for God. Hence the practices and rehearsals.

I do want to say this: this is a program filled with usual people. No one is a professional here. Most are people that, at one time, said "Oh, you don't want me in your choir – I can't really sing", or, "I can't really play that well". I hear that all the time from everyone I speak with about doing something like this. Everyone. I actually heard it from a lot of people who you saw standing in front of you on Palm and Easter Sunday. Somewhere along the line, they came to agree to spend a little time with each other, do some, practicing, and give it a whirl. Anyone can do this. And when we get a critical mass together to make this happen, you get a product like you see this past Holy Week or on Christmas. And I don't think that there was a single person that gave up time on Thursday evening, or Wednesday afternoon, or a Sunday morning, that regretted it in the least. It was truly an exceptional, exhilarating time.

While I am at it, I want to sincerely thank all the musicians that were here to help us celebrate Easter: All the musicians that came in from the "outside", all the musicians and friends that are here to help us on a regular basis, and in particular, all the choir members and First Church musicians that took part on our music. None of this could have happened without you. You enliven all the music that is done here. Thank you!

Now, onward and upward: the BoMM is presenting a coffeehouse concert in Palmer Hall on April 26 at 7 – we are bringing in the fabulous Silk City Jazz Band for your listening pleasure. We are requesting that you consider a plus or minus 10.00 donation, although we don't want this to be a deal-breaker regarding your ability to come. No matter what you can contribute, please come, sit down and enjoy some delicious snacks and freshly-made "mocktails" for free, and have an evening out hearing this terrific band. And, if you have a mind to, bring your dancing shoes - you could even dance a few steps!



Bags are provided for ages newborn through teen with an average of 25 bags per month.

Our three leaders, Becky Goss (20+ years overall coordinator & boy bags), Nancy Wadhams (10+ years girl bags), and Terri Carlson (10+ years infant bags) will be leaving their posts later this year. It's currently a well oiled machine but new blood and improvements are in the wind!

Nancy Wadhams will host our meeting on Monday, May 13th, where we hope to create a framework for going forward. A tutorial on what we do and how we accomplish it will be provided as well as physical examples.

We have heard many wonderful creative ways to accomplish this task and hope you will join in this mission. There is such satisfaction in knowing you are providing a desperately needed service to both damaged children and harried social workers.


