# **Pastor Pondering**

This is my 2023 Annual Report; I share it here that it might be a bit more widely read.

We might think of 2023 as First Church's return from exile. There's a Bible story about that.

In 587 BCE the Babylonian Empire invaded the kingdom of Judah, destroyed the temple in Jerusalem, and sent thousands of Jews into exile in Babylon. For fifty years (generations), the Jews suffered there, until Persia captured Babylon, and the Persian king, Cyrus, allowed the Jews to return to Judah and rebuild the temple.

Certainly, our hardship at First Church doesn't compare to that of the Jews in the Bible story, but we too have experienced an exile of sorts. Between COVID, followed by a burst sprinkler in the sanctuary, we were forced to worship in a strange land of parking lot and parish hall for almost three years.

You know that my wife Lourdes and I experienced an exile of our own following our daughter Abby's' diagnosis with brain cancer and death a year later. All of you showed up, quite literally, with hammer, paintbrush, and dust cloth to finish rebuilding our "temple" in time to celebrate Abby's life, while marking our church's return home. Praise God!

In exile over generations, the Jews lost a lot of the glue that held them together as a people, and it didn't all just come back with the rebuilding of the temple. We too lost something, and not just numbers on Sunday mornings. In those first months of 2023, there was a sense of starting over, of figuring out what it means to be the church post-COVID, in-person and online, in a world turned upside down. But like the daffodils in front of the sanctuary, we are springing forth, beautiful and fully alive! Indeed, 2023 had been a year of return from exile and rebuilding.

My response to our return has been (mixed metaphor alert!) to play "small ball." Our resident Phillies fan, Rev Kev, could say more about the term, but according to Wikipedia, small ball "emphasizes placing runners on base and then advancing them into scoring position for a run in a deliberate and methodical way." This, as opposed to getting lots of home runs. In this rebuilding year, I have sought to kindle and rekindle as many relationships as possible, one conversation over a cup of coffee at a time.


It is worth noting, that I have sensed a change in the quality of some of these conversations following Abby's death. You are more inclined to open up about personal trials You are experiencing in your life (everybody has something). I often hear the words, "well, you understand." Which is not to say we spend all our time together weeping by the rivers of Babylon (Psalm 137). Connecting around trials enables us to then speak hopefully even joyfully, of return and rebuilding. What a gift; I am grateful for the wonderful stories shared by so many.

This has, indeed, been a year of return and rebuilding, both for First Church, and in our lives. Someone suggested that we might create more opportunities to share our stories with one another. Of course, not all stories are made for sharing publicly, but I bet with a little help and encouragement, many might find it meaningful to write or tell some of your beloved stories. Our stories are glue that binds us together, and having sat across a table and a cup of coffee from many of you, I can affirm, you've got glue!

Watch for opportunities to share our stories in the year to come as we continue to build upon the foundations of sanctuary and story.

This is the day that the Lord has made. Let us rejoice and be glad in it!

# A Message from Rev. Kevin Weikel

Thank you to all of you for letting the Spirit move in your hearts at coffee hour, where people walk in and feel at home. This, friends, is how Christ welcomes all of us, wherever we are on life's journey.

Writer Anne Lamott puts it this way: I do not at all understand the mystery of grace—only that it meets us where we are, but does not leave us where it found us. At First Church, we are getting pretty good at offering this same grace that we have received, to every guest who walks through the door. For that—and for you—I am grateful.

Thank you for being the welcoming hands, feet, and heart of Jesus. May we continue to reach out to visitors, turn them into guests and build lasting connections with all who call our church "home."





We provide filled decorated tote bags which include clothing, toiletries, food, blanket, book ,stuffed animal & small toys. Bags are provided for ages newborn through teen with an average of 25 bags per month.

Our three leaders, Becky Goss (20+ years overall coordinator & boy bags), Nancy Wadhams (10+ years girl bags), and Terri Carlson (10+ years infant bags) will be leaving their posts later this year. It's currently a well oiled machine but new blood and improvements are in the wind!

Nancy Wadhams will host our meeting, where we hope to create a framework for going forward . A tutorial on what we do and how we accomplish it will be provided as well as physical examples.

We have heard many wonderful creative ways to accomplish this task and hope you will join in this mission. There is such satisfaction in knowing you are providing a desperately needed service to both damaged children and harried social workers.


### Sunday Morning Flowers


