Mary valiantly battled many medical ailments for many years. In 1981, she began receiving services at West Mont and was a Hillside resident at the time of her passing. Ron began receiving our services in 1985. He was a resident at our Townsend House. Over the years, he participated in various West Mont vocational programs.

Change for the Future! An update from VP of Operations, Patrick Sheehan

Recently, West Mont introduced two new positions to our Operations Department. These positions are Direct Support Professional Manager and Program Coordinator. The new positions are an intricate part for the future of West Mont and will provide a new level of stability to our group homes and vocational sites.

Three Program Coordinators will provide administrative and operational support to the multiple locations they oversee. This position will bridge the gap between the Administrative office and the numerous locations throughout Helena. West Mont has a lot of new mid-level managers and in conjunction with the current Program Managers, West Mont will prepare these new managers to lead the new generation of West Mont staff. Also, it will not be an uncommon occurrence to see the Program Coordinators on the frontlines teaching our new staff members how to properly care for individuals with disabilities.



The position of Direct Support Professionals Managers will provide the extra support to the Program Manager at the group home or vocational site they are assigned, but this position will also be a "Program Manager in Training." The Direct Support Professional Manager will be able to do all the job duties of current Program Managers at West Mont and be able to step in at any group home or vocational site in the absence of a Program Manager.

These positions are an exciting expansion of West Mont and will enable us to help serve more individuals with disabilities in the future. We look forward to investing in the future of our employees through these changes!
