Renovations included adding on an 8th bedroom, extending the living room and family/exercise rooms, remodeling the kitchen, pantry, office, and break/craft room, relocating the laundry room and adding a med room. New items include: a roof, furnace, covered deck, carport, flooring, fire alarm, and insulation. All doors were widened to be ADA accessible and a new ADA ramp added. 
West Mont In The Spotlight
