
West Mont Cheer Squad Celebrates 10-Years

West Mont is delighted to announce that SMA Architects was awarded the contract to assist us with the Community





new residential structure. They will also evaluate alternative locations on the property and create a priority list along

with cost estimates and comparative analysis of options.

We are excited to be moving forward on this project. We owe a tremendous debt of gratitude to the Lewis and Clark County Commissioners for sponsoring our PAR Grant application and thanks to Laura Erickson, Lewis and Clark County Development Coordinator for all of her assistance.

Every once in a while an employee comes along who epitomizes all of the incredible qualities you wish everyone in the workforce would have: a positive, can do. attitude including an ever-present smile and pleasant word for all co-workers; excellent attendance, loyalty and commitment to the company; always looking for something else to do when all other assignments are completed - and done right the first time; and, ready to step in and help when someone else is struggling. At West Mont we are fortunate enough to have such a person. Her name is Jodi Hines and she is a Direct Support Specialist Assistant (DSSA).

When Jodi was in High School enrolled in a combination of Special Education and regular classes she was always impressed with what a difference her teachers could make. So, she decided she wanted to work with people, too, and that there was no reason to let her developmental disability stand in her way. After graduation she had a job at a fast food restaurant, was employed at a nursing home, and then at a popular restaurant for eight years.

Then, ten years ago Jodi was in Helena visiting relatives for the summer. Her grand-

mother suggested Jodi contact West Mont's Farm & Gardens about volunteering. Jodi loves animals, helping others and working outside, so it seemed like a perfect fit and indeed it was. After several months we were so impressed with her sense of responsibility and teamwork that we created the DSSA job description and offered her a part time job. Other than a break for not quite a year to join family in Arizona, Jodi has been a mainstay at the Farm. She has duties at both the group home and the vocational program and works side-by-side with the Program Managers, Assistant Program Managers and the Direct Support Specialists.

As Jodi once told a reporter for the Apostrophe magazine, "I don't see myself as disabled. I can do the things that anybody else can do. I can teach myself to go further than I think I can." And, her empathy for our clients is certainly heartfelt. "I see what they go through every day and it makes me feel closer to them. I understand where they are at. They can help themselves, but I can help them along." Jodi would gladly work more than 20 hours a week at the Farm, but Social Security has earning caps which limit her monthly income, so it has worked out nicely to have her on staff part time all these years.



Integrity and work ethic are qualities we can all learn from working with Jodi. For these, and all of the reasons listed above, it was my honor to nominate Jodi Hines for the A2Z Employee of the Year. Thank you Riley and all of the great staff at A2Z staffing for selecting Jodi as this vear's winner. The presentation on March 3rd was fantastic, complete with the cake and award, and a day all of us will never forget.



Supported Living Services - Helping People Live Independent Lives

Although many people are aware of West Mont's residential, vocational/employment, and nursing care services, you may not know that we also provide **Supported Living services (SL)**. Supported Living services are for people with physical and/or developmental disabilities living in their own home. West Mont staff provides the support, supervision, and training to provide our clients with the necessary skills to live as independently and safely as possible.

Living skills taught may include planning nutritious meals, cooking, household maintenance, shopping, laundry, personal hygiene, budgeting, and money management. Clients are also taught safety tips such as how to access emergency services if needed, how to recognize and avoid interactions with people who may take advantage of their vulnerability, wearing safety vests if walking at night, etc.

Other services can include job support. Although clients may be working in a community based job, they still might need on-the-job assistance and

coaching which can be provided on a short or long-term basis. If needed, our staff can work with

the client side by side or they can provide a lesser level of support. All services are personalized and include assisting clients with social skills, activities, and appropriate behavior with an emphasis on community

integration. Recreational and social activities may take place with the individual or in a group setting. Clients are taught manners, how to be a team player, and to respect others. Clients may also participate in the West Mont Cheer Squad and on our Special Olympics teams.

Supported Living Services are funded by the **Department of Health and**Human Services (DPHHS) Disability Division. The level of all services and the categories of services are determined by the dollar amount of the client's approved cost plan, the qualifying individual or guardian, a Case Manager, and West Mont. Currently, West Mont serves 36-clients in the Supported Living program. Susan Pesta, V.P. of Supported Services & Agency Relations oversees the division. The Program Manager, Tabby Morley has been with West Mont since 2009. She was an Assistant Program Manager at West Mont's Humbolt Apartments prior to being promoted to program manager. Ryan McAlpin is the Assistant Program Manager (APM). Ryan joined West Mont in 2011 and, prior to becoming the APM, he was a Direct Support Specialist II in Supported Living. Supported Living Services provide clients with the tools they need help them enjoy life to its fullest!
