West Mont Farm & Gardens Project Update

NEWS As we go to press, **SMA Architects** has finalized the bid documents for the West Mont Farm & Gardens group home renovations and we are awaiting approval by the **Department FLASH** of Commerce. Once that is done, a legal ad with a Request for Proposals from contractors will be published. Sealed bids will be opened 30-days after that and a contractor chosen. We anticipate construction will begin sometime in April and take 4 - 6 months to complete. This spring we will also break ground on **Morgan's Maze** and you will soon see it take shape. It has been a long road to get to this point and we are excited to be moving forward. An official groundbreaking for each of these projects will be announced once we have firm dates.
