





**63%** of CRMSDC MBEs have annual revenues over \$1 million








Class 4 (> \$50M) - 4.69%



## The Business Case for Supplier Diversity



### **Small Business Facts**

- Represent 99.7 percent of all employer firms
- Employ half of all private sector employees
- Pay 45 percent of total U.S. private payroll
- Have generated 60 to 80 percent of net new jobs annually over the last decade
- Create more than 50 percent of non-farm private gross domestic product (GDP)



### **Small Business Facts**

- They are innovators. Produce 13 to 14 times more patents per employee than large patenting firms. These patents are twice as likely as large firm patents to be among the one percent most cited.
- Are employers of 41 percent of high tech workers (such as scientists, engineers, and computer workers).
- Are 53 percent home-based and 3 percent franchises.

## What is the Value of Supplier Diversity?

- Provides competitive access to procurement opportunities for all vendors, especially those that have been historically underutilized
- Provides greater access to the "Best Value" for:
  - Tax payers
  - Customers
  - Policy makers



## What is the Value of Supplier Diversity?

- Stimulates economic growth in diverse communities
- Economic development and job creation equals expanded customers, viable tax base, increase giving, education and good health



## The Business Case For Supplier Diversity

- The current minority population is 37% of the total U.S. population.
- By the year 2060, the Census Bureau projects that the minority population will represent 57% of the total U.S. population.
