

ATTENDANCE

If a child is to be absent, please call the school office at 610-373-3316 by 8:15. Upon returning to school, please use the school's excuse form and indicate why your child was absent from school. A student is considered late if not *in their classroom* by 8:00 AM. Students who are late need to report with their parent to the office for a late slip.

WEDNESDAY COMMUNICATION ENVELOPES

Each Wednesday, the youngest in each family receives an envelope from the school office. Please take out the contents, examine them and RETURN THE ENVELOPE TO SCHOOL THE NEXT DAY. SHOPS, tuition payments, forms, etc. may be put into the envelope when they are returned.

LUNCH PROGRAM

Sacred Heart offers a daily hot lunch program through Maschio's Food Service. The cost for the meal per day is \$4.00. Students have option of buying a school lunch or bringing their own lunch. Students do not have access to a refrigerator or a microwave, so please pack accordingly. Lunch menus are sent home monthly. Milk and Ala Carte items may also be purchased on a daily basis.

Lunch times are 11:35-12:00 for grades K-4 and 12:05-12:30 for grades 5-8.

DRESS CODE

Students in K-8 are to wear the official school uniform. The school uniform, as well as the gym uniform, may be purchased at McGinn School Apparel 12 South 5th Ave., West Reading 610-939-1503. Certain articles of "Spirit Wear" are acceptable for gym. Gym uniforms are worn to school on your child's gym day. (grades K,1,2 & 4 – Monday; grades 3,5,6,7 & 8 – Tuesday)

Pre-K uniform is a red polo shirt & navy blue shorts, skort or pants.

UNIFORM SWAP

This service is offered to all Sacred Heart parents to subsidize their child's uniform supply. Uniform items that are outgrown can be dropped off at the school at any time. Parents may also go through the racks at any time for needed items. You do not have to drop off an item to select an item you need.

TRANSPORTATION

ARRIVAL/DEPARTURE

Students may enter the building between 7:30 a.m. and 8:00 a.m. and report to their assigned area according to grade. **K-8**Students arriving after 8:00am must be accompanied by a parent/guardian into the school office to be signed in.

At 8:00 a.m., community prayer & Pledge of Allegiance are conducted.

The dismissal bell rings at 2:45 p.m. (K dismisses at 2:35; Pre-K at 2:15) Car riders are walked to the back door leading to the parking lot. Walkers are dismissed from the 7th Avenue exit and bus riders are dismissed from the main exit.

Changes in dismissal must be sent in writing, or a phone call made to the office by 1:30.

CAR RIDER INFORMATION

Students arriving BETWEEN 7:30 & 8:00AM are to be dropped off in the parking lot behind the school. Enter the alley from Lakeview Dr. (Cherry St.) on the Church side of the alley), (Lakeview Dr.), pull into the lot and allow your child to exit your vehicle. If more time is needed with your child, please pull into a parking space to allow other parents to continue drop their child off. DO NOT PARK OR DROP OFF IN THE SCHOOL BUS ZONE between 7:30am & 8:00am

DIRECTLY IN FRONT OF THE MAIN DOORS.

K-8 Students arriving to school *AFTER 8:00AM* must be accompanied by a parent/guardian to the school office. Pre-K students arriving after 8:15am must use the front entrance and be accompanied by a parent/guardian to the school office. At dismissal, parents are to enter the alley (Cherry St.) on Lakeview Dr. (Church side), enter the lot and *back your car into a parking space*. Teachers will accompany the children into the parking lot with stop signs. Parents will be instructed by the teachers when it is safe to leave your parking space after all children are in their cars.

Please exit the lot to the east, toward Seventh Street. Students should not be picked up in the front of the school. This is strictly for school bus use only.

BUS INFORMATION

Bus transportation is available for grades K-8 from your home school district. If you would like bus transportation, please fill out the appropriate bus district form and return to the school office. You will receive notification from your home school district regarding bus number and stops.

AFTER SCHOOL CARE

After School Care is available to Sacred Heart School students from dismissal until 5:30 PM. There is no After School Care on early dismissal days.

You will receive a bill for the previous week in your weekly envelope. You may pay in person, mail in your payment or pay via the tuition website (Simple Tuition Solutions). Delinquent payments will be referred to the principal for further investigation and could result in future use of the ASC program being denied until payments are up-to-date.

IMPORTANT EVENTS

- BACK TO SCHOOL NIGHT This event is held at SHS on a weekday evening prior to the first day of school. All parents and students of Sacred Heart are invited to attend this social event. Games and refreshments are provided and representatives from many of the school's events, organizations and volunteers are present. A letter and email will be distributed verifying the date & time. Parents are strongly encouraged to take advantage of this opportunity to take on an active role in their child's Sacred Heart experience.
- **MEET THE TEACHER NIGHT** This event is held in September after the children have been back to school for a couple of weeks. At least one parent is highly encouraged to attend this evening as important information is distributed from the teachers in the classroom setting. The evening begins in the gym with a presentation by the Principal to review school wide procedures in greater detail. Children are not permitted to attend this event.
- CHRISTMAS BAZAAR The Sacred Heart Christmas Bazaar has been a tradition at our school for generations. It is held on the 1st or 2nd Friday in December when the school gym is transformed into a Christmas Village. Students, parents and parishioners are treated to a day of fun and shopping. There are items available for sale such as handmade crafts, Santa's Attic, books and ornaments to name a few. Games, face painting, baked goods, gift wrap and pictures with Santa are also available for the enjoyment of all. The raffle table is a huge draw with over 100 raffle items! Raffle items are new and range from \$20.00 on up to hundreds and are collected from donations from parents or grandparents and corporate solicitations. Raffle tickets are available for pre-purchase as well on the day of the Bazaar. Each homeroom is assigned a block of time to take part in the festivities with the youngest grades going first and the eighth graders helping out and attending throughout the day. Parents will receive the schedule ahead of time so they can plan on attending with their child. This is highly recommended especially for the younger grades. An upperclassman may be available to assist the youngest students if a parent is unable to attend. Parents are asked to send their child into school with a shopping bag marked with the child's name and some spending money for raffles, gift buying and/or baked goods. This is also a red & green dress down day for our students.
- BAZAAR PREVIEW PARTY The Sacred Heart Bazaar Preview Party is an <u>adult only event</u> held the evening before the Christmas Bazaar from 6-9pm in the gym. A lovely evening of hor d'oeuvres, wine and beer, entertainment and fellowship with Sacred Heart parents and parishioners. A small donation is collected at the door. The Children's Bazaar raffle table is open for preview and <u>additional</u> <u>raffles are added for this event only</u> such as spa treatments, sport tickets, gym memberships, purses and jewelry to name a few. <u>One of the best activities of the night</u> and something you never want to miss as a Sacred Heart parent is the <u>live auction featuring the art work of our very own school children</u>. Each grade begins their art work in September with the help of our Art teacher. Their class projects are put up for bid and used to raise money at this event.
- CATHOLIC SCHOOLS' WEEKS EVENTS Catholic Schools Week is a weeklong series of events that are fun, informational and inspirational. It begins on the last Sunday of January at the Sunday, 9:30am mass and is followed by an Open House / Winter Carnival in the school gym. Information will go home in your Wednesday envelope shortly after we return from Christmas vacation which will include the week long schedule of events.

IMPORTANT EVENTS

• WALK FOR ANNUAL FUND – This is a very important event of the school year. The Annual Fund is our annual appeal for contributions from alumni, parents of alumni, grandparents, parents, staff and friends of Sacred Heart School to help defray the costs of a Catholic education that tuition revenue alone does not cover. It is a testament to our faith and our commitment to give our children a quality, Christ-centered education and an opportunity for families to fulfill their family assessment fee. The "kickoff" for Walk for Annual Fund is typically held the first Monday in March. A packet of information will go home this kick off Monday in March with your child and will include instructions, letters of donation requests, envelopes, remittance envelopes, volunteer form, permission form and a t-shirt order form. All student t-shirts are free to the student and may be used as the gym uniform following the walk. No other homework will be assigned this night so all families are able to complete their donation letters. Families returning completed packets the following day will receive a dress down pass. A contest is held for the 8th grade to design the walk t-shirt.

The Walk for Annual Fund is generally held on the first Friday of May with the following Monday reserved for the rain date. The day begins with a school wide group picture on the front steps of the school at 10:15am. The children return inside to line up and exit the side door of the school (7th Ave) by grade to begin their walk. Grades K-4 complete a 1½ mile walk which ends at Happy Hollow Playground in Wyomissing while grades 5-8 complete a 3 mile walk. A picnic of grilled hot dogs, snacks and baked goods is waiting for the hungry walkers and special guests.

FAMILY ASSESSMENT FEE

<u>Each family is required to fundraise \$550.00 each school year</u>. Fundraising may be done through the SHOPS/Scrip program and or the Annual Fund. It is the responsibility of the Home & School Association to raise funds each year to cover a portion of the total school budget. Therefore, we must have total parent participation in all fundraising endeavors. Any donation sent to SHS in your child's name will be deducted from your assessment fee due.



REBATES earned through our **RAISE RIGHT gift card program** are credited to your assessment balance also. This program is offered as a service to our parents as well as a fundraising program for the school. Various grocery stores, restaurant, retail stores, hotels and airlines offer REBATES on their gift cards when ordering through our program. You purchase gift cards at FACE VALUE and the retailer sends SHS the REBATE. (rebates vary from retailer to retailer) That rebate is deducted from your assessment fee. You may also send a SHOPS envelope (sent home monthly in your Wednesday envelope) with your order into school with your child. SHOPS orders received before Monday morning at 9am will receive their order Monday afternoon. If you send a SHOPS order in Tues/Wed you can expect your order to be sent home to you Wed. afternoon. Orders sent in Thurs/Fri will be sent home the following Monday.

Each Sacred Heart Family has a \$550 assessment fee which must be paid by June 1st.

Sacred Heart School has partnered with Simple Tuition Solutions (STS) to manage the tuition and billing beginning the 2022-2023 school year.

To complete the setup of your STS tuition payment plan, please follow these 4 simple steps:

- a. Click on the unique link specific to Sacred Heart: https://app.simpletuitionsolutions.org/register?sc=20425 If you happen to land on a page that asks you to enter a School or Scholarship Organization Code, you want to enter code: 20425
- 2.) If you do not already have an account with STS, you want to click "Create a new account".

 ** If you already have an account with STS, click "Sign in", and enter your previously created login and password. **
- 3.) Upon creation of your account, you will be sent to a page that will allow you to "Start a new Payment Plan". Be sure you are selecting the proper school year you are creating the payment plan for.
- 4.) The payment plan creation process is 5 easy steps counting the review/authorize page, each step will save as you advance to the next step. You are able to use the 5-step tool bar across the top of the page to toggle back to a previous step and make any necessary edits. However, please note, once you submit the payment plan and it enters "Pending" status any changes would need to be made by reaching out to your school's administrator.

To view your balance, update your information or to make payments, you can access your STS account anytime at: https://app.simpletuitionsolutions.org and login using your previously created account information.

*STS simply manages tuition and billing payments for your school and follows policies established by your school. Tuition amounts, Financial Aid amounts, Scholarships and all other tuition and billing related decisions are made by your school. *

To complete the STS Financial Aid Application, please follow these 6 simple steps:

- 1.) Click on the unique link specific to Sacred Heart School: https://app.simpletuitionsolutions.org/register?sc=20425
 - a. If you happen to land on a page that asks you to enter a School or Scholarship Organization Code, you want to enter code: 20425
- 2.) If you do not already have an account with STS, you want to click on the Orange Button "Create a new account".

 ** If you already have an account with STS, click "Sign in", and enter your previously created login and password. **
- 3.) Create your account
- 4.) Upon creation of your account you will be sent to a page that will allow you to "Start a new Application". Be sure you are selecting the proper School year you are seeking assistance for.
 ** Note: You may include ALL of your students on one application, even if they attend other private schools **
- 5.) The Application Process is 8 Steps counting the payment step, each step will save as you advance to the next step. You are able to use the 8-step tool bar across the top of the page to toggle back to a previous step and make any necessary edits. However, please note, once you complete the process of uploading your required financial documents it will lock the application from all editing. At this point, if any changes would need to be made to the submitting application, you can gladly email STS at support@simpletuitionsolutions.org or call at 717.599.7611 option 1.
- 6.) After completion of the payment process you will be advised as to which financial documents you need to provide STS. You will also be sent an email that outlines what you need to provide as well as introduce you to the application processor that will be handling the review of your application. **Please Note:** You can simply scan or take a photo of your financial documents and upload them into STS's system using STS's convenient upload feature. This is the fastest way to provide STS with your required financial documentation. However, you can also mail the signed copies of your financial documents to STS to the following P.O. Box address: **Simple Tuition Solutions, LLC, P.O. Box 779 Camp Hill, PA 17001.** Once your financial documents are loaded the system will lock the application from all editing. At this point, if any changes would need to be made to the submitting application, you can gladly email STS at support@simpletuitionsolutions.org or call at 717.599.7611 option 1.

Finally, once STS has received all of the required financial documentation from you, STS's application processors will verify the data and review your entire application per Pennsylvania State Law to determine your eligibility for any state programs. You will be notified directly via email upon the completion of this verification/review process. In addition, the results will also be available to your School or any Scholarship Organization associated with the scholarship. It is important to note that STS is only contracted to handle the verification and eligibility determination, therefore, DOES NOT have any input, control, or insight into scholarship amounts or when they may be awarded.





ACCESS FAMILY PORTAL

(formerly OptionC)

Dear SHS Parents:

SHS is now using **FACTS** family portal which is a private and secure parents' portal that allows you to view academic information specific to your child/ren, while protecting their information from others. *ALL Sacred Heart School families are required to create an account on our Family Portal.*

You will be able to view your child's grades, attendance, homework, conduct, important announcements, school event calendar as well as other useful school information.

Here's how to access YOUR FAMILY PORTAL:

- In any browser, go to FACTSmgt.com and click FAMILY LOG IN, then FACTS FAMILY PORTAL
- ENTER SHS SCHOOL DISTRICT CODE: SHE-PA
- Scroll down and click CREATE NEW FAMILY PORTAL ACCOUNT
- Enter your email address and CLICK CREATE ACCOUNT An email will be sent which includes a link to create your Family Portal login. The link is active for 6 hours.
- Select the CLICK CREATE YOUR FAMILY PORTAL LOGIN link on your email.
- A web browser displays your NAME and FACTS Person ID
- Type a **USER NAME, PASSWORD**, and **CONFIRM** your password.
