# **Pastor MiMi's Musings**

Lent to Easter....Winter to Spring....
Our Pilgrim journey....

As we journey through winter and Lent to spring and Easter, I have been spending time in discernment and preparation for my ordination (hopefully this summer.)

As I shared one Sunday, I attended the closing service of a church in Northside at the end of 2021. During the prayers, Pastor's message, conversations with church members and especially when singing the closing hymn - For All this Saints – I felt tears on my cheeks many times. It was a testimony to lives of service and discipleship well lived and also a reflection of changing times and realities.

Reflecting on it that night and in the weeks following, I keep thinking that I do not want to be the Pastor who leads Pilgrim church on its closing journey. I so hope and pray that is not in our future together. I do not believe in my heart of hearts that it is.

I am excited to serve Pilgrim Church and Preschool, the UCC, and our larger community. I believe that a faith community is a vital part of living and I want to help more people to find a church home. I want us all to grow in experience of being God's beloved.

We are going to try some new things as we emerge from Lent, winter and COVID – hopefully! We will all need to work together in a spirit of welcome, possibility and hope.

We have many reasons to be encouraged: Our 151st (!) Annual Meeting and the updating of our foundational documents is a huge step forward. Having ALL our leadership positions filled is encouraging. And welcoming new liturgists, ushers and greeters is inspiring. Brandon's gifts and talents are a blessing to all of us. Peggy is helping us until we find a new Administrative Assistant.



All human beings are God's children. God created us, loves us and cares about us and is sovereign over all of us. Because God cares for each of us, God asks us to care for all people. Though people live in different countries, and are from different racial and ethnic groups and speak different languages, we are all called by God to care deeply for each other. We, as Christians, are part of the Family of God. The symbol pictures the unity of the human family we are called to help create. 



# **Christmas Kitchen News**
