Pastor MiMi's Musings

Reflection is good for the soul

In this time of change of seasons and as we journeyed through Lent to Easter, it is good to take time to reflect and recenter in our good God's loving embrace.

As part of my ordination path and being an official authorized minister in the UCC, I am invited to create a ministerial profile. Several hours, twenty-plus pages and multiple edits later, I was relieved and rejuvenated. It is empowering to name and claim the action of God in our lives.

Looking back on our Pilgrim journey together fills me with gratitude. I would like to share some of the insights with you as a thank you note of sorts.

Serving at Pilgrim to serve as a licensed pastor has further instilled that sense of being at home. In writing up the summary for license renewal, I saw how God has used all that has come before in my life to help prepare me for this part of my journey. I am so grateful and amazed to have found a home in the United Church of Christ.

I noted three accomplishments at Pilgrim:

- 1. I helped form and guide a leadership team 'Pilgrim Reboot 2.0' that updated our foundational documents (Constitution and By-Laws); created an organizational chart; reviewed and established policies and procedures; and created a behavioral covenant "Pilgrim Covenant of Grace." As the chair proclaimed: "Yes, after many months of hard work, the Reboot Team is presenting a new Constitution and By-laws. We as a church set a timeline of every 5 years to review our documents. It has been 9 years since our last review, so we are long overdue."
- 2. My ordination was a beautiful event that the Pilgrim Community really embraced. I suggested we approach it like inviting family and friends over to a party at your house. We made some much-needed physical improvements and did some deep cleaning and organizing, including interior and exterior painting and signage. Bright exterior painting and signage (primary colors of the rainbow) makes a more visible

- welcome to our Church and Preschool. We also had a summer Yard Sale which raised some funds by selling unneeded stuff we cleaned out.
- 3. I spent some time to focusing a bit on our presence both virtual and print to help promote our weekly service and special events. I updated our Facebook account, and started Instagram and Nextdoor accounts. I also, researched and contracted with a provider to update our website and the Preschool's website. I set a schedule for our newsletters and instituted a weekly email with the bulletin and announcements. In addition, I worked with a graphic designer to create a brochure. She also created a new logo for our Preschool and a similar one for our Church.

I shared my overall approach to ministry:
Love God. Love neighbor. It really is that simple. That is the theme of our holy books and the best of our lived faith tradition. The love of God cannot be separated from a love of self and a love of others. Our walk as Christians is not only about God and me, but perhaps even more importantly about God and us. I have grown to appreciate how the various threads of my life are woven together and how they come into play in my life's work and ministry.

One of my favorite quotes that sums up my theology of ministry is from Anne Lammot: Our preacher Veronica said recently that this is life's nature: that lives, and hearts get broken – those of people we love, those of people we will never meet. She said that the world sometimes feels like the waiting room of the emergency ward and that we who are more or less OK for now need to take the tenderest of possible care of the more wounded people in the waiting room, until the healer comes. You sit with people, she said, you bring them juice and graham crackers.

An early formative experience was an alternative Spring Break service trip in rural Appalachia where I learned and experienced the power of the ministry of presence. I have known in my life the healing and transformative power of time and attention and a seemingly small gesture of kindness and care by a friend or family member – or even a stranger. I am grateful to serve as an ordained minister.

80% Approach book by Dan Sullivan

Dan Sullivan's book <u>80% Approach</u>, is written for the business world. He talks about how businesses often want to have everything perfect or at least close to perfection. There are things that need to be 100%; a heart pacemaker can't work 80% of the time. And there is nothing wrong with working on making improvements. The "problem" is a business can get so wrapped up in the 20% that they are not happy with, they lose track of the 80% that is good. They can destroy their business if they ignore the 80% that is good.

A psychologist suggested we apply this 80% idea beyond business; use it for everyday life. How often do we get ourselves focusing on a problem that it blinds us to all the good? 80% is the number Dan came up with. Your number may be 90% or 70%, but you get the idea. If I enjoy the overall experience I get from a group, organization, church, etc., I shouldn't let the few things I don't care for keep me away. This doesn't mean we can't discuss ideas and make changes; but let's never

forget to celebrate the good!

Adult Conference June 19th—23rd

Adult Conference is full of endless possibilities where faith is deepened and broadened, ministry leaders are born and nurtured, and fellowship within the wider Church is strengthened. The UCC and DOC (Disciples of Christ) Ohio conferences are joining together for this year's Adult Conference. The theme, All Things in Common, is from Acts 2:42-47, and celebrates the ecumenical partnership of our two denominations. The festivities take place Monday, June 19th through Friday, June 23rd at Northwest Christian Church in Columbus, OH. If you want to enjoy a week of learning, worship, singing, fellowship, Bible study and relaxation, then this program will spiritually revive you. Evening vespers, keynote speakers, and daily Bible lectures are highlights of each day led by ministers from each denomination. There are also a variety of workshops to choose from such as the presence of God in our everyday lives, approaching spirituality as we age, music as worship and several others. Cost is \$230 (which includes two meals per day). Lodging is at a nearby Hampton Inn (\$520/four nights, two queen beds). - The church was beautifully decorated with Easter flowers, along with donations of flowers that were delivered to our at home members. We coordinated two fundraisers; 30 pieces of Silver and The Fawn Candy. We had a Lenten bible study on Sundays after church discussing the "Last Words of Jesus".
- Vickie Clark is working to complete the church banner from the squares that we made at the church picnic. We plan to present the new banner on Pentecost Sunday, 5/28/23.

Mission & Outreach

The Board of Mission and Outreach plans and carries out several programs during the year. In the fall, we have a Back to School collection to provide uniforms or clothing for Camp Washington kids returning to school. Also in the fall, we sponsor a coat drive that was started by our dear friend, Joanie Flaig. We collect coats that remain in lost and found at schools or from others who have gently used children's coats and hoodies. These coats and hoodies are washed and then distributed to families who need help providing warm clothing for their children.

Joanie's Coat Ministry will continue each year or at least every other year.

In November, we collect food for Truth & Destiny Church and Delshire School. We also collect food for both of those places on the first Sunday of every month.

In December, we receive information from CO Harrison and Delshire Schools for our Giving Tree Ministry. We are able, with the help of Pilgrim Preschool to provide gifts for the families who need assistance at Christmas. Thanks to the generosity of the Pilgrim members, we have been very successful with this ministry.

We are open for new ideas, so please don't hesitate to communicate with our members. We will try to feed the women at the Homeless Shelter and we will coordinate with another church to provide food and hygiene bags for the homeless. We thank you for your ongoing support for all of these programs.

Preschool Board

The Preschool has received a grant. Money from the grant is being used to purchase some new technology items and will be used for building improvements which will include some funding for air conditioning the Preschool classrooms.

As a fundraiser, the Preschool will be hosting a vendor night on May 12 where vendors can set up booths to sell their products.

Miss Barb, one of the Preschool teachers will be retiring after many years with our Preschool.

The Personnel Committee has been meeting regularly. Updates have been made to the employee handbook. Unfortunately in January we had to terminate our Administrative Assistant,
