Pastor MiMi's Musings: Coming Home

Thank you for accompanying me on this incredible journey. It was a blessed day shared with so many who have filled my heart and life: my parents; brother and family; aunt and cousins; high school and college friends; my ex-husband and in-laws; all 4 children!; prayer warrior moms; colleagues in ministry from CAIN (Churches Active In Northside), peace and justice efforts - especially in the women's ordination movement in the Catholic Church, First United Church of Christ and Pilgrim church families, the wider UCC, and the larger ecumenical community.

As I shared: Today is truly a homecoming

Two things I have been sure of my entire life is that I am called to be a leader in the church and that I am called to be a mother. From early on when I felt this nudging around the time of my First Communion, these were two seemingly incompatible vocations from where I was planted. I could not be a priest because I was a girl. And even if I were able to be a priest, I could not be a mother. I have tried to be true to these calls my entire life and lived with the inherent tension and contradiction within my Roman Catholic faith.

As I was approaching my sixties, I needed to be part of a church that at a micro and macro-level affirms my gifts and call and is an authentic prophetic voice in our world and truly models the inclusive and expansive love that Jesus exemplifies.

In October 2018, I joined the First United Church of Christ. In the 4 years since, I continued to feel a deeper sense of home and connection to the UCC – woven with a consistent thread in my adult life: my spiritual journey and religious participation is inextricably linked to our quest for a better world.

And being welcomed here at Pilgrim to serve as a licensed pastor has further instilled that sense of being at home.

Our new "Be the church" Banner presented and displayed today is our pledge and promise to ourselves, to each other and to God to continue to be an open, affirming and inclusive congregation dedicated to peace with justice for all.

Being ordained today in a community of believers is being true to my authentic self and to the calling God has continued to lay on my heart and mind. I am so grateful and amazed.

As part of my remarks, I would love to sing a song. As any of you who are familiar with my singing talents, you know I am not going to do that. Music is a transcendent connection to the sacred for me. So Brandon will be playing a song that serves as part of my testimony for today. Surprisingly it's not a Bruce Springsteen song (there will be a few of those at the reception!) Most of the ones that I considered are ones I learned during the time I was part of the Mother of Christ community and their fabulous gospel choir ministry that brought me healing and hope during the lowest points in my life. Several fit today: Please be patient with me, God is not through with me yet. Order My Steps in your Word. God's Still working Miracles. Hope is Alive. I Need You to Survive. I know my Redeemer lives.

The one that I am sharing is another influence that I have shared with Pilgrim folks before. Sweet Honey in the Rock. Listen and singalong if you'd like. As we prepare to share communion together, we can claim the truth and proclaim our faith:

I don't know why the angels woke me up this morning soon

I don't know why the blood still runs thru my veins I don't know how I rate to run another day I am here still running, I believe.

My God calls to me in the morning dew The power of the universe knows my name Gave me a song to sing and sent me on my way I raise my voice for justice I believe.





USHERS, GREETERS, LITURGIST, TECHIES, and MUSIC

We have lots of new and exciting things happening at Pilgrim! Some are due to us learning to live with Covid and some are just new and refreshing as we move forward into the future.

USHERS: Only one usher will be needed each Sunday.

- Arrive between 10:00 and 10:10 am.
- Make sure doors are unlocked and open.
- Turn on sanctuary lights.
- Light candles.
- Keep programs spread out on tables.
- Count the number attending, fill out a blue sheet and put it in the offering box.
- Take the offering box up front when the Doxology begins to play.
- When worship is over, make sure candles and lights are out, and the offering is taken to the office and put in the safe.

First Sunday of each Month:

- Make sure the red wagon is in the Narthex.
- Place communion in the communion basket on the table with the bulletins. Make sure there are napkins in the basket.
- Take the wagon and food items up front with the offering box during the Doxology.

Communion Sunday:

- If ushering, get the communion out of the refrigerator and get napkins from the communion room.
- Put communion back in the refrigerator after service and put the napkins back in the container in the communion room. If you notice the communion cups are running low, notify the office so they can be reordered.

How can you serve our worshipping community?



GREETERS:

- Arrive between 10:05 and 10:15 am.
- Stand or sit in the Foyer or Narthex and welcome all as they arrive.

LITURGISTS:

- Arrive between 10:15 and 10:20 am.
- Enter worship service with MiMi.
- Read scripture which will be sent to you via email prior to Sunday.
- Assist MiMi with communion at the communion table.
- Remove all of your reading material from the lectern when you leave the service.
- Carry the offering basket when you leave the worship service with MiMi.

TECHIES:

- Arrive between 10:15 and 10:20 am.
- Set up video Zoom to go live at 10:25 am.
- When worship is over, stop live recording.

MUSIC: If you like to sing or plan an instrument, please help out our Minister of Music by signing up. There will be a sign-up sheet in the Narthex. Or contact Vickie Clark (513-574-8542) or Debbie Heintz (513-200-1646) if you wish to volunteer.

Sign-up sheets will be available in the Narthex beginning on 11/20. The schedule will be sent to you in December and will be in effect all of 2023. If you have any questions, ask one of us.

Pilgrim UCC Historical Snapshot: Susan Sroczynski shared this short history as part of her welcome during the ordination service:

The story of our congregation began in nearby Cheviot where one German Evangelical Protestant congregation split in two. Apparently, we were the more liberal, independent group who broke away for 3 reasons;

- 1. We wanted a location closer to the people living west of here,
- 2. We wanted to be able to drink beer either in church or on the grounds and most importantly,
- 3. We were determined to have a church that was truly protestant and evangelical in spirit where we could be free to make our own decisions about our faith.

And so this church began in the summer of 1870 with 43 charter members. Before there was even a building, the Ladies Aid Society was formed where the women would gather to cook meals and take them to the residents in the community who needed them. That was the beginning of a rich history of service to others.

The cemetery donated land for the building of the first church which was completed in 1872. Services and records were in German until 1923. At this time the church name was officially changed to First Evangelical Protestant Church. In 1945, Protestant was changed to Congregational.

In 1960 the church joined the UCC and renamed it - Pilgrim United Church of Christ. At the same time, the church built the present sanctuary and educational and fellowship wing.

Things have changed over the years; we are now a small but mighty group. Our mission has always been to serve others and to spread the love of Jesus Christ. It is with great jubilation our 20th senior minister, MiMi Chamberlin, minister in training, has led our church family with her love of God and love of serving others. This, her ordination day, is truly a special day in the 152nd year of this congregation.
