Grateful For Taxes?

April 15, (or 16, or 17, or 18) are dates etched in my memory. April 15, unless it falls on a Saturday, Sunday or legal Holiday, is the day that taxes are due for fiscal year tax filers. It is a day that I dreaded for years because I would always procrastinate in filing my taxes. It's not that I think taxes are unfair or too political, or that I didn't want to pay them, I procrastinated because I was always afraid that I would owe more than I

could pay. All of that changed when I met, fell in love with and married a woman who is gifted in money handling and planning and who is able to look at money clearly and not emotionally. My anxiety disappeared and so did my procrastination.

And they came and said to him, "Teacher, we know that you are sincere, and show deference to no one; for you do not regard people with partiality, but teach the way of God in accordance with truth. Is it lawful to pay taxes to the emperor, or not? Should we pay them, or should we not?" But knowing their hypocrisy, he said to them, "Why are you putting me to the test? Bring me a denarius and let me see it." And they brought one. Then he said to them, "Whose head is this, and whose title?" They answered, "The emperor's." Jesus said to them, "Give to the emperor the things that are the emperor's, and to God the things that are God's." And they were utterly amazed at him. Mark 12:14–17

This may shock you, but I am actually grateful that we pay taxes, that we fund the government so that it can do things I cannot do by myself.

Taxes provide revenue for federal, local, and state governments to fund essential services--defense, highways, police, a justice system--that benefit all citizens, who could not provide such services very effectively for themselves. Taxes also fund programs and services that benefit only certain citizens, such as health, welfare, and social services; job training; schools; and parks.¹

I am grateful, because, as is noted above, I could not afford to pay for my children's educations if I had to pay the dollar amount of services my children received while they were in school. I could not have helped people who I don't know and who I will never meet, be able to get food and medical care and educate their children because of our tax dollars. I am grateful that when someone who has worked hard all their life runs out of money, our Social Security taxes and Medicare taxes support their living. I am grateful because together we can send aid to other people around the world.

I am grateful that God uses us to work together in order to share our blessings. I am aware that we don't all agree on which taxes are necessary and which are unnecessary. I can't help but admire the fact that God even uses "what is due the emperor" to make our lives better. Some, but not all, of our tax money goes to help the very people who Jesus reminds us that God wants us to care for. A group of us are finishing up a Bible study of the gospel according to Luke which focuses on Jesus lifting up the lowly. We are asked to lift up the lowly in his name. I believe some of our taxes help do that. So, thank you for doing your part to make the lives of our fellow humans better. Please note that I am not saying citizens, because our tax dollars help non-citizens as well. I wonder if thinking about our taxes in this way might make us grateful that we are able to make a difference in so many lives
