

Grateful or Frustrated?

Thoughts from Pastor Jeff . . .

"April showers bring May flowers," was one of my mother's sayings. No, I know she didn't invent the phrase, she just liked it. She would offer it whenever any of us hit one of life's little speed bumps. Loosely translated, her message was, it may be sad now, but something wonderful is coming. Well, sometimes that actually proves to be the case, while other times, not so much! When speed bumps happen, I think its okay to be frustrated. I also think that it is possible that we are responsible for a lot of the speed bumps we face. Many years ago, I read a book by Richard Carlson, Ph.D. titled, Don't Sweat The Small Stuff with Your Family. One of the issues he addressed was that we were in charge of how we reacted to

"small stuff." Depending on the way we framed (looked at, perceived) an issue, we would either find ourselves smiling and grateful or frustrated and annoyed. He illustrated this by sharing a list of things one partner found frustrating about the other. It had things like: always leaves the cabinet door open. Leaves dishes next to the sink and doesn't put them in the dishwasher. Leaves the cap off the toothpaste. You get the idea. Carlson suggested that we could choose to experience such things as reasons to be annoyed, or feel disrespected, or taken for granted, or frustratied because we have complained about them more than once. Alternatively, we could choose to look at them as reminders that our partner was present, had little quirks and habits and was to be celebrated because of their commitment to us. Of course, what goes unsaid is that none of us are perfect and we all do things that get on our family's nerves.

While this approach to life probably doesn't apply to everything, I suspect it might apply to more than we might think. We can choose how we react to things when they are not exactly as we would like them to be. We can choose to remember that it is often our differences that make life more interesting. We can choose to let each other's imperfections be endearing reminders that we share this life together, or we can choose to let them frustrate us. Choosing gratitude might be the more labor-intensive choice, especially when we are feeling unappreciated, but gratitude will make everyone happier. That's a lot better than a bunch of frustrated people walking around, don't you think?
