BUDGET 2024 AT A GLANCE

Fianna Fáil delivers a progressive and fair budget, focused on investing in public services and easing the cost of living for individuals, families and businesses.



Budget 2024 will deliver better outcomes for those who need it most. The threshold for paying the higher rate of tax will be raised by €2,000 to €42,000

CUTS TO USC

Fianna Fáil in Government is making cuts to USC. The 4.5% rate is being cut to 4%. This is the first reduction in USC rates in five years

RENT TAX CREDIT INCREASED TO €750

In last year's Budget, the Government introduced the Rent Tax Credit to support renters. This will now be increased from €500 to €750 per year for 2024

FREE SCHOOL BOOKS

Building on the revolutionary introduction of free school books at primary level by Education Minister Norma Foley this is now being expanded to Junior Cycle students, worth over €300 per child

HALF-PRICE PUBLIC TRANSPORT

Half-price fares on public transport have been **expanded** to include **24** and **25-year-olds**



Fianna Fáil is conscious of the impact of rising interest rates and mortgage costs on many households. One-year Mortgage Interest Tax Relief of up to €1,250 will be introduced for eligible households

3 X €150 ELECTRICITY CREDITS

Aware that energy bills remain high, Budget 2024 aims to ease the pressure with $3 \times €150$ electricity credits for all households, to be paid between the end of this year and April of next year

CHILDCARE FEES REDUCED BY A FURTHER 25%

Following a 25% reduction in last year's budget, childcare fees are being reduced by a further 25% in Budget 2024. Average saving of €417 per child per month

1,000 NEW GARDA RECRUITS

Funding has been allocated for recruitment next year of 1,000 Gardai to build stronger, safer communities









RECORD COST OF LIVING PACKAGE

- **€450** in once-off **energy credits** for every household. Three credits, each worth €150, to be paid between the end of 2023 and April 2024
- €400 lump sum for Working Family Payment recipients in November
- €400 lump sum payment in November to recipients of the Carer's Support Grant, Disability Allowance, Blind Pension, Invalidity Pension, Domiciliary Care Allowance. This will benefit 350,000 people
- €300 Fuel Allowance lump sum to be paid to 370,000 people in November
- €200 Living Alone Allowance lump sum for 230,000 people

- €100 once-off payment to people who receive the Qualified Child Increase
- **Double Child Benefit** payment for 1.2m children in December
- Double payment of Foster Care Allowance
- Christmas Bonus for social welfare recipients in December followed by a further double payment in January to assist with cost of living. This will help 1.3m people
- €250m in supports for school transport, State exam fees, higher education student contribution fees
- €250m in business supports
- Extension of the Young Adult Travel Card

INCOME TAX REDUCTIONS

- €1.3bn tax package putting hundreds of euro back in the pockets of low to middle earners
- Income tax higher rate threshold raised by €2,000 to €42,000
- Reduction in middle USC rate band from 4.5% to 4%
- Entry threshold to the 4% rate of USC to be raised to €25,760
- €100 increase in the Personal, PAYE, Earned Income, Home Carer and Single Person Child Carer tax credits
- €200 increase in the Incapacitated Child Tax Credit
- Extension of VRT relief for Battery Electric Vehicles to the end of December 2025

UNPRECEDENTED HOUSING BUDGET

- Record €5bn capital investment in housing
- Extension of Help-to-Buy Scheme to the end of 2025
- Increase in Rent Tax Credit from €500 to €750
- Overall investment in affordable housing €1.5bn
- Up to €1,250 Mortgage Interest Relief for eligible households
- Tax break, worth between €600 and €1,000, for small landlords who commit to stay in the market
- €207m to bring back vacant and derelict units through the voids programme and Croí Cónaithe scheme

REDUCTION IN CHILDCARE COSTS

- Further 25% reduction in childcare costs, bringing total reduction to 50% by September 2024
- The National Childcare Scheme (NSC) universal subsidy will increase from €1.40 per hour to €2.14 per hour from September 2024
- For families receiving the universal subsidy this will mean up to €5,007 per annum (or €417 per month) off their bill per child

SOCIAL PROTECTION

- Record Social Protection budget worth €2.3bn
- €12 increase in weekly welfare and pension payments from January 2024
- Working Family Payment thresholds for all family sizes to increase by €54 from January 2024
- Parent's Benefit to be extended from 7 weeks to 9 weeks from August 2024
- Child Benefit extended to 18-year-olds in full-time education from September 2024
- New Pay-Related Benefit to be introduced for Jobseekers in O4 2024
- Weekly rates of qualified child payments will increase by €4 in January 2024 bringing them to €54 for those aged 12 and over and €46 for under 12s
- Carers Allowance earnings disregard increased to €450
 Single / €900 Couple
- Domiciliary Care Allowance will increase by €10 to €340 per month from January 2024

INVESTING IN EDUCATION

- Free school books worth over €300 per child per year for Junior Cycle students in secondary schools
- Free Hot School Meals to be extended to a further 900 primary schools, bringing the total to 1,400 schools
- Over 1,216 SNAs and 744 Special Education Teachers
- Fee waiver for State Examination fees extended for students sitting Junior Certificate and Leaving Certificate exams
- Additional €92m for School Transport Scheme

INFRASTRUCTURE, CLIMATE AND NATURE FUND

• €14bn by 2030 to allow for sustained levels of investment in infrastructure in the event of economic downturns and to support climate and nature related projects

NEW FUNDS

FUTURE IRELAND FUND

 The Future Ireland Fund, with a potential to grow to over €100bn by the middle of the next decade, will help to protect living standards and public services for current and future generations

AFFORDABLE HEALTHCARE



- €500m to tackle waiting lists, including opening and staffing six new surgical hubs
- Expansion of the free contraception scheme to include women aged 17-31
- **Increased** funding for digital health
- The first full-year programme of publicly-funded Assisted **Human Reproduction Services** including IVF
- €36.3m package of surge measures for acute and community
- 75c increase in Excise Duty and VAT on a pack of 20 cigarettes
- Tax on e-cigarettes/vapes to be introduced in Budget 2025

INVESTMENT IN DISABILITY



- €20.5m for 100 residential places for adults and children
- €10m in new respite services
- €8.5m to improve children's services including the recruitment of additional therapy positions
- €18.2m for day services for 1,250-1400 young people leaving school in 2024
- €2m for 80,000 extra PA hours to promote independent living and additional home support

MENTAL HEALTH FUNDING

- **Increased funding for staffing of Child and** Adolescent Mental Health Service (CAMHS) teams
- **New CAMHS** recovery colleges
- **New** Youth Mental Health app
- Pilot central referral mechanism "No Wrong Door

LARGEST ALLOCATION FOR OLDER PERSONS



- New funding to support nursing homes with HIQA compliance measures
- **Increase** of €4.2m for **meals on wheels** and day centres
- New dementia-specific weekend day centres

REDUCING THE COST OF TRAVEL



- Half price travel for Young Adult card holders expanded to 24 and 25 year olds
- 20% fare reduction on public transport continued to the end of 2024
- Free Travel Scheme extended to people medically certified unfit to drive from July 2024

CLIMATE ACTION AND ENVIRONMENT

- €1.159bn in Budget 2024 to support families and communities with energy costs
- €380m for **SEAI residential** and **community energy** upgrade schemes, including the Solar PV Scheme
- €348m to progress rollout of the high-speed broadband network next year

BUILDING SAFER COMMUNITIES

- Over €3.27bn in current expenditure
- 1,000 new Garda recruits and 250 new Garda staff
- 25% increase in the Garda overtime budget for high visibility policing
- Garda training allowance to rise to €305 per week
- Budget for Irish Prisons Service increased by over €27m to
- Additional €12m for Zero Tolerance Strategy, including a new Domestic, Sexual and Gender Based Violence (SGBV) agency and support for the delivery of refuge accommodation
- Further €2.9m for Youth Justice Strategy bringing total to €33m
- €4m for Gambling Regulatory Authority

HIGHER EDUCATION



- Fees for university students cut by €1,000 on once-off basis. Families whose household income is between €62,000 and €100,000 will also receive an additional €500 off their fees
- From September 2024, student contribution fees will be abolished for all incomes under €55,924
- Increase in the Postgraduate Fee Contribution Grant from €4000 to €5000
- Once-off reduction of 33% in the contribution fee for apprentices
- Rent Tax Credit extended to parents who pay for their student child's rent in "digs" or Rent a Room accommodation. This will be backdated for the years 2022 and 2023

SUPPORTING IRISH BUSINESS



- National minimum wage to increase to €12.70 per hour
- Extension of 9% reduced VAT rate for gas and electricity until 31st October 2024
- Phased restoration of excise rates on petrol, diesel and marked gas oil
- €145m Smart Regions fund announced
- Increase in R&D Tax Credit to 30%
- Once-off €250m fund to support up to 130,000 small and medium sized businesses

AGRICULTURE - PRIORITISING FARM INCOMES



- Over €100m in supports for beef and sheep sectors
- Over €700m for agri-environment initiatives in 2024
- €8m in targeted support for tillage farmers
- €57m allocation to support organic farmers
- €110m for the National Forestry Programme
- €8m for capital investment in the food sector

DEFENCE



- €1.23bn Defence budget
- €176m for capital funding for Defence Forces communications systems and military aircraft and equipment
- €12m for 400 new military personnel
