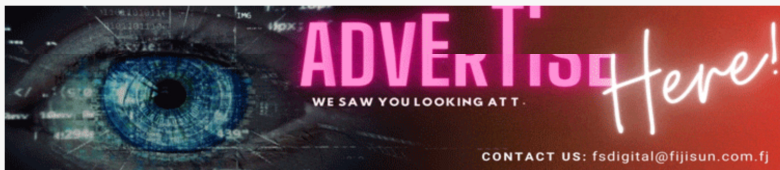
this campaign for two years now, we have grown to be very fond of it and would be pleased to provide any future assistance to the Fiji Cancer Society.”
