

4th Grade Book Projects

The fourth graders get to read one book of their choice every month and do a book project with it. A majority of the reading needs to be done at home. One week before the book project is due I give time in class to gather any materials needed to complete the project and give some time to work on the project, if it doesn't get done in class it will need to be finished at home. Your child will need to take an AR quiz on the book. The AR quiz does not hold much weight with the grade of the project. Creativity and neatness are important! **First book project will be due September 30.**

Projects Ideas but not limited to

- Book talk. Talk to the class about your book by saying a little about the author, explain who the characters are and explain enough about the beginning of the story so that everyone will understand what they are about to read. Finally, read an exciting, interesting, or amusing passage from your book. Stop reading at a moment that leaves the audience hanging and add "If you want to know more you'll have to read the book." If the book talk is well done, almost all the students will want to read the book.
- Movie Poster
- Baking with Books
- Dress as one of the characters and act out a characterization.
- Diorama
- Make a timeline of all the events in the book.
- Aftermath: Write a different ending for your story
- Use magazine photos to make a collage about the story
- Make a poster advertising your book so someone else will want to read it.
- Venn Diagram-compare two characters in the book, compare/contrast yourself and a character in the book
- Create a Soundtrack for the book
- Make a game board for the book you read.
- Make a bookmark for the book, drawing a character on the front or pictures that represent the book, including the title and author of the book.
- Write a multiple choice quiz of the book with at least ten questions

- Write a script of one of the chapters of the book.
- Do a science experiment associated with the book1.
- Write a poem about the story.
- Make a travel brochure advertising the setting of the story
- Drawing-Draw and color an important, interesting, favorite part of the book.
- Write and perform an original song that tells the story of the book.
- Create a mini-comic book relating to a chapter of the book.
- Write a book review
- Book in a box
- Design a new Book cover
- Google Presentation about the book
- Google slide Book Report
