# We're adding a new dimension to our Scrip gift card offering!

Check out the enclosed sheet with information on an additional way to use gift cards. St. Anne's School has Scrip, a gift card program, where you purchase gift cards for the face value and receive full face value when redeeming these gift cards at participating businesses. Participating businesses give St. Anne's varying percents (1-15 percent) of each card purchased. We have a variety of cards on hand in the office and many more can be ordered. The VISA card can be used at multiple businesses. If you request, 1% of cards you purchase may be applied to your tuition. All families are encouraged to use these gift cards for your daily purchases and they also make great gifts for birthdays, showers, weddings and Christmas.

### Safe Drop-off and Parking

You can help ensure that morning drop-off and afternoon pick-up are safe for students on our streets. Cedar Street along our front entrance is a very congested road, especially now that the actual road has been narrowed. Please follow these guidelines when arriving to school in your vehicle.

- 1. When dropping off at the main entrance, please remember to use blinkers in and out of the driving lane to signal your intentions.
- 2. Pull forward as far as possible to allow multiple cars to drop off curbside.
- 3. Do not stop in the driving lane or double park. Make every attempt to pull up to the curb.
- 4. If older siblings are chauffeuring students, please ensure they understand these guidelines.

**Preschool pickup at noon**: Preschool pick-up at noon: It's a busy traffic time during noon preschool pick-up, especially when the older students on the playground see their parents arrive in their vehicles to pick-up their preschooler. While we don't want to discourage parents from seeing those older students during recess, the parking lot becomes an unsafe play-space with cars coming in and out and students rushing over to see their parent. To remedy the situation, recess monitors will ensure students do not run to the section of parking lot where cars are parked. Parents can help too. If you'd like to make a quick visit with your older child, please walk out to the playground and away from the parked cars.
