Accredited through MNSAA

St. Anne's School has been in good standing with MNSAA since 1987. This Spring, we hosted the onsite Accreditation Team Visit and hope to be awarded our reaccreditation status following receipt of the team's findings.

Goals Achieved in 2021-2022

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- Implemented an SEL (Social-emotional learning) Program to meet the growing needs of students through these tumultuous times
- Fundraising campaigns resulted in a 4% increase of total income over last year thus offsetting parish subsidy.
- State of the Art technology resources were purchased and put to use as a result of CARES Act funding.

Goals Established for 2022-2023

- Enhance our Catholic Culture at all levels: staff, student, family
- Assess curriculum standards to ensure alignment with Catholic Curriculum Standards in order to teacher and learn with a Catholic worldview
- Use results of the feasibility study to develop and implement a plan for building repair or improvement.

The per student cost of education this year was \$6400. The chart below represents the distribution of revenue to cover this cost. This year, school revenue resulted in decrease of parish subsidy to just 16% to total revenue.

Father Diehl Endowment

The Fr. Diehl Endowment Fund has gained momentum in recent years. Since 2016, generous contributions, coupled with expert fund management and appreciation have propelled growth from less than \$1 million to over \$2.4 million.

The fund was created in 1988 under the pretense that accrued interest from the fund would be used to support annual school expenses in order to continue to offer affordable tuition. For the past 2 years, school fundraising, grant awards and financial gifts have greatly increased which has made it possible to reinvest the annual accrued interest back into the fund.

Nearing 100 Years of Education

As we approach the 100th year anniversary of St. Anne's School we find ourselves at a crossroads. 3 generations ago (1927), parishioners set the table and built a Catholic school for our children to be educated in the Catholic faith. There have been no significant upgrades or additions in over 50 years. As we calculate the cost of repairing/replacing and improving structural components of the building, we realize we must consider other possibilities to meet our educational needs for generations to come.

A feasibility study is underway to assess the current condition of the facility, define the needs, and then present them to our Area Faith Community for review. If the responses from the study indicate a direction and a willingness to move forward with an option for improvement, a capital campaign could be launched as early as summer or fall.




















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
