Eligibility:

Children must be 4 years old by September 1 of the enrolling school year

Schedule:

Mondays, Tuesdays and Thursdays 8:10-11:30am

Structured Daily Schedule

Our daily schedule provides for a balance of teacher directed large group times, small group activities as well as child initiated and directed learning centers allowing ample opportunities for experiential and hands-on learning.

Faith Formation

Utilizing the *RCL Benziger Stories of God's Love* curriculum children learn through scripture lessons and present-day ways to live the lessons. Included are take-home leaflets to share lessons at home. Class includes daily prayer and periodic visits from parish priest. We attend weekly schoolwide prayer services and special Advent prayerservices as well as mass a couple times throughout the year.

Communication with Parents

Classroom teacher communicates regularly with parents through a weekly e-mail that includes lesson plans and important information, weekly website updates, and monthly parent letters. Parent-teacher conferences are available in October and February or as needed. Individual student progress reports are sent home 3x/year—October, February, May. School-wide information and events are reported on school website, facebook page and through weekly Home-O-Gram (HOG). Information regquiring immediate attention (ex. weather related announcements) are made through the School Messenger phone notification system.

Gym/Gross Motor Time

Our class has scheduled gym time one day each week for organized gross motor activities. We enjoy periodic visits to our school playground. Our daily routines include regular movement/motor activities as well.

Daily Snack

Table manners and socialization are naturally learned as students enjoy daily snack time. Crackers and milk are provided by the school. Occasional cooking/baking or other snack prep activities may also provided. Families are encouraged to share garden produce during harvest times for snack as well.

Celebrations

Our class celebrates each students' birthday or half-birthday. We have a birthday party for Jesus at Christmas and have special activities planned in January for Catholic Schools' Week, in February for I Love to Read Month and in March for Music in Our Schools Month. We celebrate Friendship at Valentine's Day by escaping MN winter with an indoor Beach Party.

Walking Field Trips

Throughout the year we explore our community through a few walking field trips that may include those to the post office, nursing home, fire station, and/or local parks.

Library

Students make weekly visit to the school library for book selection and check-out as well as storytime to further facilitate the appreciation and love of books and reading.

Spring Program

Preschool students provide a spring concert/program for family and friends on an evening in mid-May. This typically takes place immediately before the 1st-6th grade spring concert.
