The Robotics Programme was a particular highlight, with our ECD kids showing great enthusiasm. The outcomes of the robotics program were excellent, and the children's creativity was astounding. It was incredibly amazing to watch them use play to construct impressive things. Thank you to everyone who attended for making it such a wonderful experience!

Our Positive Parenting Programme continues to be a great success. We are grateful to everyone who participated and thank our social workers for facilitating these meaningful sessions that will impact our children and their parents.

Our ECD program continues to offer helpful and relevant services that support children's stimulation, education, and nutrition. 197 kids took part in our program in 2022, and 47 pre-schoolers successfully graduated and were ready to start their academic careers. Our curriculum places a strong emphasis on the social, emotional, and cognitive development of kids. Additionally, we place a high priority on Grade R's readiness for school and use the Circle of Courage method to instill a sense of Belonging, Mastery, Independence, and Generosity.

We would like to extend a huge thank you to our international student volunteers who have been with us. They have added immense value to our Boys and Girls Club and School Awareness Programmes. They also developed and shared an Anti-Bullying Campaign with our children and facilitators. We are so thankful for their time spent at our organization. Our kids will miss them dearly.


ABOUT UVIWE

Visits from the UNITED THROUGH SPORT students. The students did some art therapy with our toddlers and also assisted at the centres, 3 days a week.

We also appreciated and valued visits by LIFE HEALTH COLLEGE, who visited our ECD centres once per quarter and assisted us with education on oral and general hygiene, proper hand washing, common childhood illnesses and biometrical measurements.

Our ECD children enjoyed and educational outing to Funky Frogs, where they did not only have fun but also learned important skills such as waiting their turn, sharing equipment etc.

Thanks to UNISA, our New Gelvandale ECD centre now also have their very own vegetable garden from which they harvest veggies to ensure nutritional meals.











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Objective:

Our TEENS programme focus on homework/assignment support, life skills, physical & leadership development.

The programme is aimed at learners from grade 4 to 7 and is implemented every day of the week. The programme boosts academic performance, reduce risky behaviours, promote physical health and provide a safe, structured environment for children after school. As part of the Teens programme, we also facilitated 3 holiday clubs to ensure that children are safe and positively engaged during the holidays.

Various themes/topics were addressed which included role models, Values, Peer pressure, Relationships, Self-esteem, My body/Abuse/Safety

Dutch students implementing a sport and life skills programme during their visit to South Africa. Our learners did not only get to learn some valuable skills from the Dutch students, but also learnt about the differences between the countries - a very interesting experience indeed

We were super excited to introduce **ROBOTICS** as an activity at our B/G Club. The teens really love this new, fun activity.

An educational outing to McArthur's Pools where our teens learnt about the responsible use of water and water safety.

Our teens also had the opportunity to attend a **3 holiday programmes** during 2022. At the holiday programme in July, they learnt about the importance of conserving the environment. The theme at our holiday programme in October was "I am courageous - I belong, I can and I will". Our Siya Phambili programme is aimed at the protection, empowerment and creation of job readiness for vulnerable youth between the ages of 16 and 25.

The target group for the programme is out of school and unemployed youth in the Northern Areas of Port Elizabeth. The programme includes modules on personal wellness, digital literacy, entrepreneurial skills, financial wellness and workplace skills.

We value community partnerships which assists us in ensuring that the modules made available to Youth are relevant, accredited and of value. We are especially thankful for the partnership with Digify Africa who enables us to not only reach youth, but also adults with our Digital Literacy programme

A definite highlight was we had the opportunity to attend the **Momentum Metropolitan Youth Challenge - The Cube** where we were able to present our dreams and challenges re Siya Phambili to a group of professionals who assisted with troubleshooting and possible solutions.

Another highlight was the partnership with **Digify Africa.** Not only youth, but also adults benefitted from Digital Literacy training through this partnership.

We had many challenges when it came to the recruitment process for our Siya Phambili modules. We advertise online and through word of mouth because not all our beneficiaries have cellphones. Youth then sign up or people sign them up but then they don't show up for registration. Some even come and register and then don't show up on the day the programme starts. This causes a huge challenge when we have too few participants to continue with the programme and sometimes, we have a second and third registration, once we even had to postpone a programme due to lack of registrants

I attended a program called ZILP at Uviwe Child & Youth services center. The month after I then volunteered at **the Boys & Girls Club.** The Zilp program taught me so much about making the right choices in life and thinking ahead for my own future or the future of our youth and next generation.

There was a opening position at Uviwe Child & Youth Services Center in the year 2021 and I applied for a Facilitator position for the Boys & Girls Club. Personally, I grew more and more every time I walked into and out of Uviwe's building.

Today my life, **PROFESSIONALLY**, has changed. From being a **ZILP PARTICIPANT** to **VOLUNTEERING** at their **BOYS & GIRLS HOLIDAY CLUB** and there after being a **FACILITATOR** at the **BOYS & GIRLS CLUB AFTERSCHOOL** to being employed as FRONT DESK ASSISTANT in 2023.

Topics covered in the programme included parenting styles, effective communication, positive discipline, effective punishment etc.

Our dedicated Social Workers also provided psycho-social support services and therapeutic groups focussing on anger management, grief and trauma where we aim to assist children/youth and parents with skills to cope with psycho-social issues that they might be challenged with. Our therapeutic groups was in high demand at schools and we had 7 groups during the reporting period.

Our parenting and psycho-social support programmes have been doing very well over the past year. We have amazing staff that are very passionate professionals, not just with this programme, but all our programmes including admin and support staff. With parenting, despite the struggle to get parents to show up, we have held five successful positive parenting programmes almost all in Booysen's Park, thanks to our partner, Akhanani Good Shepherd Mission, and we had one in Schauder. The programme itself was restructured from a 2-day programme to a 4-day programme. So, we were very pleased that parents have shown interest and commitment to attend for the benefit of their children.

We had many requests from schools to have short-term **therapeutic groups** with small groups. We are grateful to be able to stand in the gap and assist kids with tools and coping mechanisms to deal with these kinds of issues. We implemented 4 successful therapeutic groups at schools, namely, Frank Joubert, GJ Louw, and two at Morewag Primary.

We also re-introduced a **play therapy room** for ECD kids who have been identified as needing short term counselling. Our social workers have also had a few one-on-one clients for short term counselling.

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Objective:

The aim of our awareness programme is to empower children, youth and adults with knowledge and information about Child Protection issues.

The programme include themes such as bullying, safe people/safe space, taking care of my body and saying no to violence and abuse.

As part of our awareness programme, we also participate in National Campaigns such as Child Protection Week, Youth Day and 16 Days of Activism for NO violence against women and children.

With our **national awareness campaigns**, we hosted a **mommy and me brunch** in August last year. It was such a special event for us, with young ladies and their mommies attending, but even more because we had one of previous year's youth participant share her story of surviving violence and she was only able to do this because of the confidence and courage she built after having completed our Siya Phambili Programme where she had a safe space to come out of her shell, after the trauma she experienced.

Furthermore, our team of social workers implemented over 50 awareness talks over the last year. 5 were at ECD's including our own, they did almost all the grade 4 to 7 classes at 11 different schools and 3 awareness talks were done with 3 other organisations, 1 of them being a GBV talk in collaboration with Enough NOOW. During 16 days of activism last year, the team also reached 219 people doing door-to-door outreach in Schauderville and Gelvandale.

In December last year, we also joined **Enough NOOW's** march during 16 Days of Activism Campaign for no violence against children and women. We marched through Schauderville hotspots and prayed over our community. Despite the sore legs because we are unfit, there was such a sense of solidarity.


