Jacqueline's Journey

I was about 30 when I set foot for the first time on a church camp ground. It was a week-long high school camp. I had no idea what I was in for. I had volunteered with our church's high school youth group for about 2 years and was asked if I would be interested in helping with summer camp.

It opened a whole new world for me. Our church youth group had done some high school weekend retreats at a nearby church camp from another denomination, which was a whole new experience also.

Including that first church camp, I have been to 10 different church camps. And they all have something in common. They are holy ground. Most of them have been church camps for decades and thousands of campers, young and old, have spent transformational time there. Encountering God, the Holy Spirit, and Jesus in the natural environment, the people, the activities, the amenities, the stories told, and so much more...

The Dogwood blossoms with their scorched petals, will forever remind me that God brings resurrection of some kind out of death. The stillness of lakes will always connect me with the peace of Christ. The rushing of a creek invigorates me with the energy of the Holy Spirit inspiring me. The games connect me with the little girl inside of me and the conversation enrich my life with depth, meaning, and connections. Plus there is always so much laughter!

Our church camp, Placerville, is one of those Holy Grounds too. For over 100 years people have gathered at that beautiful place tucked in the Black Hills, with a creek running through it, to be still and know God. And you can sense that when you get there.

At any given time when you are at Placerville, it is highly likely that some random visitors will show up asking if they can look around camp, because they were there as a child, or their family had a special moment there, or any other connecting reason. If you are one of the pilgrims who have journeyed to Placerville for time with God and God's people, I hope you have similar experiences.

For me the transformation begins when I turn into the curvy road that leads to camp. For others it is when they open the car door and smell the pine trees. There is a peace that comes over me, even though most of the time I am there to work.

My soul has found healing over the last 26 years on church campgrounds, but also community, silliness, deep thoughts, connections, and all kinds of precious moments.

If you have never been, or not in a long time, I encourage you to consider going this year. There are youth camps, family camps, grand-parents/grand-children camps, and over Memorial Day weekend our church does a retreat there. Or you can come and help get the camp ready for summer use at Spring Work Weekend, April 25-28.

I am the Dean of women's camp this year, as well as the person putting together our church retreat, and I am planning to help part of the work weekend. Maybe we'll be together at Placerville, on holy ground, where lives are transformed...



MINUTES OF THE CHURCH COUNCIL

March 17, 2024

OPENING ITEMS

Meeting was called to order by Moderator Val Torstenson at 8:35 am. Self-introductions were made followed by Arlene reading the Healthy Conversation Covenant. Opening prayer, Other Serenity Prayer, was read by Val. The Council Meeting Agenda was approved.

Council Present: Julie Brunick, Dennis Evans, Kerry Evans, Kay Farrar, Suzan Gass, Dan Johnson, Don Kettering, Pam Kettering, Emma French Laird, Chris Nelson, Pat Nelson, Sylvia Selgestad, Mary Lee Stewart, Arlene Stoebner, and Val Torstenson

Council Absent: Melissa Schilousky

Staff Present: Jacqueline Hickox-Morgan and Ted Powell. Also attending: Lonnie Herrbolt (Parking Lot Task Force Member) and Dawn Henseler (Member in Discernment Team for Jerry Webber)

OLD BUSINESS

- M/S by Arlene and Mary Lee and Sylvia to approve the February 18, 2024 Minutes. Motion approved.
- Review Open Action Items:
 - •Each member to consider and think about what a Vision Statement might include. Leverage existing Vision Statement(s) to "prime the pump" at the next meeting session.
 - •Four Council members (Kerry, Suzan, Sylvia, and Val) are scheduled to meet on 4/2/24 to begin work on the Church Ministry Teams roles and responsibilities assessment (aka RASCI).
 - •All members consider and propose ideas for a "fun" aspect into how we proceed through this work throughout the year!

NEW BUSINESS

- Lonnie Herrbolt brought a drawing of the proposed parking lot. Since 2002, which was approved by the city, two additional drawings have been developed. After Lonnie's presentation, the Parking Lot Task Force shared they would come back to the Church Council by the Council's next monthly (April) meeting with a next steps timeline. The timeline will include the time and resources necessary to validate the three (3) parking lot designs; identify and prioritize the (3-4) key criteria that will be used to compare each alternative design against each other; develop the pros and cons for each design (based on that criteria); and develop their preliminary recommendation to the Church Council.
- Dan reported the Personnel Committee met last month and shared the Committee members will read the book, When Better Isn't Enough-Evaluation Tools for the 21st Century Church by Jan Hudson, to better understand their members' role in decision making.
- Dawn (a member of Jerry Weber's Members in Discernment Team) read the letter written by that Team and requested the Council to approve Val (Council Moderator) to sign the letter and send to South Dakota Committee on Ministry. M/S by Emma and Don to approve. Motion approved.
- Council members decided the best Council Meeting option is to meet monthly on the 3rd Sunday in Pilgrim Hall at 8:30 am.
- A Contact List of Council Members including phone and emails is needed for all members to possess. Laura will be asked if she can help with this.
- Annual "Mama Kathy Award" was an idea presented by Val. This award was presented annually
 at her previous church to a member for their service. Council members are to consider this opportunity.
- Val shared some highlights she gleaned from her previous Church's Transition experience that was completed this Spring. There were fourteen (14) house meetings, with 90 people involved. Each house meeting answered the same five (5) questions. 75% of that Church's members were involved in one or more volunteer engagements. In addition, highlights included sharing some statistics they learned from the largest national survey of church congregations ever conducted. As an example, median attendance in 2000 was 137 people per Sunday in 2020, average at-

tendance was 65 people per Sunday. This example, however, also included statistics of the increase in online attendance. Overall, the study found that overall attendance including onsite and online had still declined a little over 20% in that time period.

- Val distributed to the Council a short sort of cheat sheet that listed and defined key aspects of the key deliverables from any type of strategic planning exercise. The only intent would be for the Council to have as background and another quick reference, as the Council works together throughout the coming year on agree priority items.
- M/S by Emma and Mary Lee to approve Ministry Team reports. Motion approved.
- M/S by Pat and Dennis to approve the January 31, 2024 and February 29, 2024 Treasurer Reports. Motion approved with Sylvia abstaining.

MEETING CLOSURE

- Putting together worship activity boxes on Sunday mornings with children's worship bulletins and other worshipful activities to go along with the scripture of the week, current theme or season.
- Placerville Camp registration is open. We are currently holding a March Madness Bracket Fundraiser for Placerville Camperships. Brackets will be out tonight for people who have donated to the fundraiser.
- Been meeting with FUMC & TLC to plan VBS August 8-11, 5:30-8:30pm Thurs/Fri evenings & 8:30-11:30am Sat morning at Riverside Park and combined worship Sun 8/11 @ 10am with potluck.

- The choir is full speed on the March 28 Maundy Thursday service along with our guests The First Methodist Church joining our service.
