RULING ELDER FOR SPIRITUAL FORMATION AND DISCIPLESHIP

Commission

Pray for and seek to serve the people with energy, intelligence, imagination, and love.

Be faithful in watching over the people, provide for their worship, nurture, and service. Share in government and discipline, serve in councils of the church and show the love and justice of Jesus Christ.

Ruling Elders demonstrate wisdom; maturity of faith; demonstrated leadership skills; and compassion.

Vision Team

Staff Support: Pastor, Spiritual Formation and Discipleship

Purpose: To stay abreast of current research and trends in spiritual formation anticipating, recommending, coordinating and evaluating goals and approaches for effective spiritual formation consistent with the Unifying Principles of Spiritual Formation and First Presbyterian Church of Allentown's Mission Statement.

Children and Tween Ministry Team

Staff Support: Director Children, Tween and Family Ministry

Purpose: To implement and oversee spiritual formation and discipleship opportunities for children (birth-3rd grade) and tweens (4th & 5th grade) and their families that are consistent with the directives of the Vision Team and that foster continued growth as disciples of Jesus Christ.

Youth and Young Adult Ministry Team

Staff Support: Pastor, Spiritual Formation and Discipleship

Purpose: To implement and oversee spiritual formation and discipleship opportunities for youth (6th-12th grade), college age (18-21 years old) and young adults (21-35 years old) and their families that are consistent with the directives of the Vision Team and that foster continued growth as disciples of Jesus Christ.

Adult Spiritual Formation Ministry Team


Staff Support: Lead Pastor

Purpose: To implement and oversee spiritual formation and discipleship opportunities for adults and their families that are consistent with the directives of the Vision Team and that foster continued growth as disciples of Jesus Christ.

Discipleship Small Groups Team

Staff Support: Lead Pastor

Purpose: To develop and support an integrated small group ministry that engages members and friends of all ages in intentional spiritual growth that are consistent with the directives of the Vision Team and that foster continued growth as disciples of Jesus Christ.



Critical Tasks for the Position of Ruling Elder for Spiritual Formation & Discipleship Ministry Area

- 1. Attend and participate in meetings of the Session (one per month); not missing more than three (3) meetings in a calendar year.
- 2. Be an advocate and ambassador of the mission of FPCA to the Spiritual Formation & Discipleship Ministry Team
- 3. Spiritually guide, resource, and encourage the Pastor, Spiritual Formation & Discipleship.
- 4. Be prepared to lead discussions on relevant issues related to Spiritual Formation & Discipleship.
- 5. Be prepared to discuss reports/requests submitted to the Session on behalf of the Spiritual Formation & Discipleship Staff or Spiritual Formation & Discipleship Ministry Area.

Time Commitment

Three-year term; year begins May 1 and ends April 30; with a possibility of serving a second, three-year term.

Monthly Session meeting (2.5 hours per month)

Meetings with Pastor, Spiritual Formation & Discipleship (3 hours per month)

Quarterly meetings for spiritual encouragement and leadership reflection with Lead Pastor (.5 hours per month)

Spiritual Formation & Discipleship Ministry Leadership Meetings (2 hours per month)

Miscellaneous – worship leadership, emails, phone calls, contacts, additional meetings, off campus ministry etc. (4 hours per month)

Total Approximate Time Commitment: 12 hours per month
