

TSAR MEDICAL UNIT GUIDELINES:

MEMBERSHIP: Open to all TSAR members regardless of medical back ground or license. Trainees welcome to participate as associate members in all activities. Adjunct members not members of TSAR but who represent experience and can add to the fund of knowledge encouraged. Guests are welcome to attend.

MEETINGS: Frequency of at least quarterly with emphasis on quality and depth of presentations.

PURPOSES: To form a core of TSAR Members with a deeper understanding of medical issues applicable to mission and training. To have individuals who can present talks to the general membership meetings and coordinate the medical scenarios on training missions and be resources for medical questions from the general membership.

DUTIES: To monitor the medical supplies in the van and Tahoe for expiration, appropriateness and in good working order and suggest new items to be added to packs or available in vehicles. To provide educational materials or lectures to the general membership during General Meeting/Classroom Trainings. To help the Training Officer with medical scenarios during mock search training. Members who attend conferences etc. will report new information to the Unit or general members as appropriate.

MEDICAL UNIT LEADER: Maintains roster of unit members, announces format and place of meetings, liaison to Medical Director, liaison to TSAR Board, works with Vehicle Management Director, delegates responsibilities to other members, invites Medical Director to attend meetings. Maintain a library of Unit meeting minutes, materials distributed to unit of general members and guidelines for medical evaluation and treatment to use in the field. Maintain a copy of guidelines in the vehicles.

MEDICAL DIRECTOR: A licensed medical professional, Countersign medical guidelines established by the team.
