Mani's accomplishments consisted of getting crowned as Princess at the Heritage Academy Sweetheart Ball. She was a model for Chick-fil-a. She was also featured on a billboard for advertisement for Armani's Heroes Incorporated. Mani received the Best Dressed Award several times at Oakland Meadow School. She was also featured in a medical article which discussed how the doctors in France invented the first wooden shunt because she had allergic reactions to the silicone shunts. This was a successful surgery.

Every morning Mani would hum to Gospel songs as she began her day. She brought so much love and joy to everyone that she met. After every surgery, Mani would have a smile and her smile would light up the room. Our family knew that if you weren't feeling well or just having a bad day; all you would need to do is lie down next to Armani and she would help you to feel better. Armani was a great listener and she never told anyone's secrets. She also liked to join in on your conversation if you were talking on the phone. She was also an excellent babysitter and she never charged for her services. Her favorite TV show was SpongeBob SquarePants; her favorite Gospel song was Stomp by Kirk Franklin. Her favorite movie was Dream Girls.

Armaní is the inspiration behind the nonprofit foundation "Armani's Heroes Incorporated" which specializes in helping adults and children with special needs (Heroes) and their families.
