Welcome to Narvik

102 KM SOUTH OF HARSTAD, SURROUNDED BY HIGH MOUNTAINS, YOU'LL FIND THE INDUSTRIAL TOWN OF NARVIK. WITH THE SCENIC AND STRATEGIC OFOTBANEN AND THE ICE-FREE HARBOR, NARVIK HAS BEEN A CRUCIAL TRANSPORTATION HUB FOR BOTH COMMERCE AND INDUSTRY. EVERY DAY, 46 TRAINS ARRIVE OR DEPART FROM NARVIK. THE MAJORITY OF THESE TRAINS TRANSPORT ORE FROM THE MINES IN KIRUNA TO LKAB IN NARVIK, FROM WHERE THE ORE IS SHIPPED WORLDWIDE.

THE CITY HAS ALSO BEEN A CENTER FOR TECHNOLOGY, FOSTERING HIGHER DEVELOPMENT, RESEARCH, AND, NOTABLY, INNOVATIVE BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT. FOR OUTDOOR ENTHUSIASTS, NARVIK IS A PARADISE. NARVIK BOASTS A UNIQUE SKIING FACILITY WITH A BREATHTAKING VIEW OF BOTH THE CITY AND THE FJORD. THERE ARE GREAT MOUNTAIN HIKES WHETHER YOU PREFER WALKING ALONG TRAILS OR CLIMBING MOUNTAIN PEAKS. STOKMARKNES IS LOCADED 152 KM WEST OF HARSTAD. AN IMPORTANT PART OF THE CITY'S IDENTITY IS THAT STOKMARKNES IS THE BIRTHPLACE OF THE HURTIGRUTEN, AS IT WAS HERE THAT RICHARD ESTABLISHED THE COASTAL STEAMER ROUTE AS FAR BACK AS 1883. TODAY, THIS IS COMMEMORATED AT THE HURTIGRUTEN MUSEUM, WHERE THE BEACHED SHIP FINNMARKEN IS PRESERVED. WITH ITS 266 FEET, IT STANDS AS ONE OF THE WORLD'S LARGEST MUSEUM EXHIBITS.

HADSEL MUNICIPALITY IS SITUATED IN THE SCENIC VESTERÅLEN IN NORDLAND COUNTY. IN ITS BREATHTAKING LANDSCAPES AND FLOURISHING COMMUNITIES, HADSEL OFFERS A UNIQUE BLEND OF NATURAL BEAUTY AND CULTURAL RICHNESS. THE MUNICIPALITY ENCOMPASSES A VARIETY OF LANDSCAPES, INCLUDING FJORDS, MOUNTAINS, AND ISLANDS.

THE AREAS ARE SUITABLE FOR TESTING BOTH OIL SPILL RESPONSE EQUIPMENT AND ENERGY TECHNOLOGY DUE TO THE PREVALENT WEATHER CONDITIONS, ALLOWING FOR TESTING UNDER REALISTIC CIRCUMSTANCES.


