Welcome to S.A.F.E's Scholarship Program Application

Our goal is to help students with Autism reach their educational and vocational dreams.

We welcome students of all abilities to apply and request applications to be submitted by email to safeoffice@autismsafe.org in communication choice of the student – written or video. This can include videoing a submission essay using communication systems or verbal if the student wishes to in replacement of the essay portion of the application. Submission deadline is August 1st of the application year.

Eligibility Requirements

Filling out the application for scholarship indicates that the applicant meets the following criteria in addition to having a diagnosis of Autism Spectrum Disorder:

 This scholarship is for individuals who are exiting high school and are at least 18 years old, or will turn 18 by September 1st of the application year

The applicant has the desire and intent to enroll or continue enrollment in a post-secondary class (this
includes vocational, job skill-based programs) that will enhance their life through employment skills,
independent living or life skills and/or continuing education.

 Applicant will provide copies of high school diploma or GED, high school transcript if graduating in the spring of the application year, or proof of acceptance to or current enrollment in a post-secondary program.

Scholarship Expense Criteria

- S.A.F.E Scholarship funds must be applied toward tuition at a university, community college or postsecondary institution, including institutes of technology, vocational and trade schools, and including certificate, degree and non-degree programs. Note that the program must be located within the United States. Online programs must be accredited to be considered for a scholarship award.
- Scholarship funds can be used for tuition, books and tools if these costs are not already
 included as part of a tuition fee and course expenses that is being paid by a disability Waiver,
 State and/or Federal Programs.
- Up to 100% of scholarship funds awarded may be used for books and other coursework-related supplies if needed, including tools. In this case, a paid receipt will be required for reimbursement.
- At this time, classes based on physical activities do not qualify for funding (such as swimming, horseback riding or dance classes).

Please be sure to read through all of these instructions carefully to ensure you submit all required materials and that we receive everything in the correct format. Application Overview:

This is the comprehensive application checklist and a Scoring Rubric. This scoring rubric details the criteria used by our Selection Committee to evaluate all S.A.F.E Scholarship applications. Note that any materials or information received after the deadline will not be considered for review.

To be considered for a S.A.F.E Scholarship, you must submit all required materials by the submission deadline, including the following:

Notification of Receipt and Status of Application:

Once we have received your application, you will receive an email confirmation of receipt. If you do not receive a confirmation, please email safeoffice@autismsafe.org to make sure your application was received.

Once the application period has closed and scholarship determinations have been made, you will receive an email or letter notification to let you know whether we were able to award you a scholarship for this year. We intend to notify all applicants by mid-August.

Application Guidelines:

NOTE TO APPLICANTS: Please fill out the forms as independently as possible, to the best of your abilities. We understand that you may need assistance from a parent, guardian or friend, but we want to read your own, individual responses to the following questions, so we can get a full picture of your accomplishments, goals and personality. Note that written responses are preferred, but audio-recorded responses are also acceptable.

NOTE TO PARENTS/GUARDIANS: We understand that some applicants need assistance with filling out this form. We do prefer to read applicants' own, individual responses to the following questions, so we can get a full picture of their accomplishments, goals and personalities. Scoring Rubric

This scoring rubric details the criteria used by our Selection Committee to evaluate all S.A.F.E Scholarship applications.

Each S.A.F.E Scholarship application is evaluated based on five categories: **Personal**, **Accomplishments**, **Goals**, **Community Impact** and **Extras**. Applicants may be awarded between 0 and 5 points in each of these categories based on the following criteria:

Personal	The applicant has provided a full picture of their personality, interests and values. They have richly demonstrated what is important to them by sharing their hobbies, passions and/or hopes for the future. The selection committee is able to gain a clear vision of the applicant's life, individuality and what makes them unique. When will the next S.A.F.E application be available?

Applications for a S.A.F.E Scholarship open in April of each new calendar year for funds to be granted for the fall of that same year.

When is the deadline for applications?

The deadline for the S.A.F.E Scholarship is midnight of August 1st of the year of application. Anything received electronically after this deadline will not be considered.

How do I submit my application?

Applications to be filled out and submitted electronically via email or Dropbox to safeoffice@autismsafe.org. Please note that applications and supporting materials sent after the submission deadline will not be considered.

How my application will be evaluated? How can I know what makes a great application?

We have supplied the Rubric for evaluating applications that our Selection Committee will take into consideration. We encourage our scholarship applicants and any assisting individuals to refer to this rubric to learn the elements that make for a great application.

Do I have to have been accepted into a program or class to apply?

No! We encourage you to apply even if you are just thinking about applying for a post-secondary program or considering taking courses. Applications received past the deadline will not be considered, so even if you are just considering a post-secondary program, it is best to get your application in and be prepared!

If I don't have Autism but I have another developmental or intellectual disability, am I eligible to apply for a S.A.F.E Scholarship?

No. To be eligible for a S.A.F.E Scholarship, the applicant must have Autism. This is the mission of S.A.F.E, applicants can have other disabilities along with an Autism diagnosis to be eligible.

Who can I ask to write a letter of recommendation for me?

We love to hear from others how you have inspired them or touched their life in some way!! A few examples of people you can ask are good friends, teachers, employers, coworkers, or religious leaders. Please ask them to keep their letters to one page or less in length.

Can I still apply if I am in high school?

Yes, if you will be at least 18 years old and graduating by September 1st of the application year.

What do I need to include in my application for it to be complete?

Please see the Application Checklist to see everything you will need to submit for your S.A.F.E application to be considered complete. If any required items are missing, we will be unable to consider your application. **We highly encourage you to submit "extras"**—items that will help us get to know you better and give us a clear vision of your personality, strengths, accomplishments, and future goals. Extras are not required, but they are highly recommended due to the competitive nature of the application process! Also be sure to refer to the Scoring Rubric for more information about what makes for a great application.



What do you mean when you ask me to submit something to help you get to know me better?

You can submit pictures, artwork, drawings, poems, a video of you doing something you are proud of, a personal video you made...the possibilities are endless!! We want to get a clear vision of your personality, accomplishments, activities you enjoy, and your future goals. We want to know what is important to you, so be creative! If you send pictures or video files, please be sure they are not password-protected and are able to be downloaded, so we can share them with the Selection Committee for review. Please keep videos to five minutes or less in length.

Will the items I submit with my application be returned?

No. All submissions become property of S.A.F.E and will not be returned. Please do not submit items that you will want back.

I need a little help filling out my application. Is that ok?

Yes, but we ask that you fill out the entire application as independently as possible and to the best of your abilities. We recognize that you may need assistance from a parent, mentor, or friend, but we want to read your own, individual responses so we can get a full picture of your accomplishments, goals and personality. Note that written responses are preferred, but audio-recorded responses are also acceptable. An assisting individual may wish to add to the application whatever they feel is needed to help us get to know you better. We also welcome one family member or friend to submit their own essay if they would like to provide additional information or inspirational stories about you.

How will my S.A.F.E Scholarship application be evaluated or scored?

All S.A.F.E Scholarship applications are evaluated by our Scholarship Selection Committee—a group of caring individuals who are committed to the S.A.F.E mission. The Selection Committee uses the criteria detailed in our Scoring Rubric to evaluate all applications based on five different categories: **Personal**, **Accomplishments**, **Goals**, **Community Impact** and **Extras**. Applicants may be awarded between 0 and 5 points in each of these categories. Please see the rubric for more information.

How much money is awarded per scholarship recipient?

S.A.F.E Scholarships are up to \$1,000.00 for reimbursable tuition, books or equipment per awarded individual. NOTE: Scholarship recipients must use their scholarship funds within one year and any unused awarded amount will be forfeited by the award recipient.

If I am awarded a scholarship, how and when will I receive the funds?

With proper documentation, S.A.F.E can send the scholarship funds directly to the university or program you are attending. Scholarship recipients (or their parents/guardians) can also be reimbursed for tuition, books or other qualified expenses if they submit receipts and other required documentation showing payment information. If you are awarded a S.A.F.E Scholarship, you will receive detailed instructions about how to access your scholarship funds.

When and how will I find out if I am awarded a S.A.F.E Scholarship?

We will contact all applicants via email and U.S Mail by Mid August. If you have not heard anything by that time, feel free to send an email to safeoffice@autismsafe.org.

If I do not receive a S.A.F.E Scholarship this year, can I apply again next year?

Yes, individuals who apply for a S.A.F.E Scholarship are welcome to apply again the following year, whether or not they are selected to receive this year's scholarship award.

If I have received a S.A.F.E Scholarship before, can I apply for another this year?

Yes! Prior recipients can reapply as soon as the following year!
