GATHERING YOUR SUPPLIES

Over a century ago, Emmert Wolf wrote that "a man is only as good as his tools." True to a certain extent, I believe this quote has been a key reason why some beginner artists get disheartened when they start their art journey. Many times beginner artists believe that owning the best art supplies is key to creating great art. To me the opposite is true... If you can create art with entry-level art supplies, imagine what you can create with superior-quality products?

Science has even proven that when our brains are tasked with finding visual solutions with limited information, they become serious problemsolving machines. By giving your brain fewer things to work with it actually creates more! Some of my favourite artworks were created with limited mediums.

So I want to challenge you to not use this guide as a shopping list but rather use it as a reason to audit your stash. Take the list, and check off what you have and do not have. Once you have established which supplies you do not have, find alternative products that could possibly work. Only after you have done your little audit are you allowed to shop - wink wink!

When purchasing paint or any colour I recommend buying a limited palette of colours. If you want to add colours to your palettes, I recommend doing this after the first chapter of the course. Once you understand how to mix colours and which colours you like (personal colour palette) I suggest buying colours accordingly.

If there is more than one medium option like watercolour paints and watercolour markers, the weekly videos will cover the gap. Every week will have a list of supplies and colours used per project. You can also request assistance or ask questions via the Facebook page or during the Thursday live sessions.

When purchasing the course I cover all the above content in the introduction section. Part of the course introduction is this PDF document which contains the Art Club 2024 requirements list, colour suggestions and a supply audit sheet. I really recommend taking the time to work through your supplies and getting acquainted with them before we start the course.

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My RECOMMENDED COLOUR GUIDE

MIXING COLOURS WILL CHANGE THE WAY YOU SEE EVERYTHING, WHICH IS WHY I ALWAYS START WITH COLOUR THEORY IN EVERY WORKSHOP OR CLASS I TEACH. UNDERSTANDING COLOUR AND ITS INFLUENCE ON YOUR WORK WILL INSTANTLY TRANSFORM YOUR ART. I RECOMMEND MIXING COLOURS OVER BUYING THEM. THIS SAVES YOU MONEY AND ALLOWS YOU TO PURCHASE VARIOUS TYPES OF PAINTS TO FIND YOUR PREFERENCE. THE COLOURS LISTED HERE SERVE AS A POINT OF REFERENCE. ONCE YOU GET INTO THE HABIT OF MIXING COLOURS YOU WILL BUY COLOURS ACCORDING TO WHAT YOU NEED. I MOSTLY BUY SHADES OF YELLOWS, BLUES AND REDS.

THE TRADITIONAL PRIMARY COLOURS

HAVE YOU EVER TRIED TO MIX PURPLE AND ENDED UP WITH BROWN? FUNDAMENTALLY THE PROBLEM IS NOT YOU - I PROMISE. IN SCHOOL, WE WERE TAUGHT THAT THE PRIMARY COLOURS ARE RED, BLUE AND YELLOW. IN A WAY, THIS TEACHING IS CORRECT BUT ALSO SUBJECTIVE TO THE VIEWER. WHY? IT ALL COMES DOWN TO THE WAY WE INTERPRET COLOURS. WHAT I SEE AS A PRIMARY BLUE OTHERS SEE AS A TURQUOISE. WHICH IS WHY THE FIRST THREE COLOURS I LIKE TO HAVE IN MY PALETTE ARE THE BASIC PRIMARY COLOURS.

My PRIMARY COLOURS

PRINTERS FASCINATE ME. AND BEFORE YOU DECIDE TO STOP READING BECAUSE THIS STATEMENT IS WEIRD, LET ME EXPLAIN... ONE DAY I SAW A PRINTER PRINTING A PHOTO IN FOUR LAYERS. EVERY LAYER WAS A DIFFERENT COLOUR (THE COLOUR OF MOST PRINTER INKS ARE CYAN, MAGENTA, YELLOW AND KEY AKA BLACK). THIS MADE MY BRAIN EXPLODE AND I RAN TO MY STUDIO. I TOOK SIMILAR COLOURS TO THE INKS FROM MY PAN AND STARTED MIXING. FINALLY, I COULD EXPLAIN TO STUDENTS WHY THEIR COLOURS ARE BROWN. IT'S NOT THE RATIO OF COLOUR BUT RATHER THE COLOUR ITSELF.

THE BASICS OR NEUTRALS

WITH PRACTICE, YOU WILL FIND SHORTCUTS TO MIXING COLOURS. MIXING PRIMARY COLOURS WILL ALWAYS BE YOUR FIRST STEP FOLLOWED BY THE ADDITION OF OTHER COLOURS SUCH AS WHITES, BLACKS OR BROWNS TO CHANGE THE TINT OR TONE OF THE COLOUR. MOST NEUTRALS ARE A COMBINATION OF PRIMARY COLOURS SO THEY WORK PERFECTLY FOR TWEAKING COLOURS.


