# Thoughts in my head from Pastor Jason

The month of Ramadan is a holy time for our Muslim friends. According to Islamic tradition, the Prophet Muhammad (pbuh) was on a spiritual retreat in a cave near Mecca when the Angel Gabriel appeared to him and revealed the first verses of the Qur'an (Islam's sacred scripture). Whereas we believe our Holy Bible was inspired by God and written by human beings, our Muslim friends believe the Qur'an was dictated word for word. As such, their belief is that the Qur'an is the word of God.

For Christians, we believe that Jesus is the Word of God, not our bible. The Gospel of John sums this up quite nicely in its opening verse: *In the beginning was the Word and the Word was with God, and the Word was God* (John1:1).

The season of Lent and the month of Ramadan have many similarities. Both are a time of fasting, reflection, and prayer. Both are meant to bring us in to closer relationship with God and with each other. The Islamic calendar is a lunar calendar, so the month of Ramadan moves back a little each year. Of course, Easter and Lent are also different dates each year, as the dates are based on the Spring equinox. This year, Lent and Ramadan overlap quite a bit. A central part of each holy season is the spiritual discipline of fasting.

Fasting is a part of many religious traditions and has been observed by Christians for thousands of years. The purpose of our fasting during Lent is to emulate Jesus and memorialize his forty days of fasting in the wilderness and being tempted. Our lives, though, are filled with many more than forty days of temptation. From the time we are born until the time we die, we face trials that can often lead us astray. Our Lenten fast is meant to remind us that we are children of God and siblings of Christ.

We will celebrate iftar (breaking of the daily Ramadan fast) with our Muslims friends again this year – on the Monday of Holy Week. I invite you to share with them what you have learned during Lent and what your fast has meant to you. May God continue to guide us and light our way during the solemness of this season.



# **Special Mission Offerings: Pink Envelope**

Each month, our church supports a special offering to benefit other organization's missions to serve God and neighbor.

March 2024: Community Meal is a new Pink Envelope offering, to help with the costs of our very successful Community Meal. Every month, the Growth and Outreach team feed 60 - 80+ people, who come to share dinner, and/or take dinners to go. The money goes to cover the cost of the food and supplies.

**April 2024: ONE GREAT HOUR OF SHARING** is an ecumenical offering supported by the United Church of Christ. The funds collected are used to support disaster relief and economic development to underserved communities around the world, proclaiming our shared faith in Jesus Christ to all the nations.

May 2023: The Alber Scholarship offers annual awards to college students in our congregation. This fund is an historic partnership between West Park UCC and Wittenberg University. The monies collected in this offering are used to bolster the amounts awarded, providing aid with ongoing educational expenses.
