
DATA ON HOMELESSNESS IN HELENA OVER THE YEARS

175 individuals in our coordinated entry system who have engaged with social service agencies in the past

3- 6 months. Agencies including Good Samaritan Ministries/Our Place, PureView, Volunteers of America, and St. Peter's Health enter neighbors into the Homelessness Management Information System (HMIS) and we work collectively to move these individuals closer to stability.
