Joy



³ With joy you will draw water from the wells of salvation. ⁴ And you will say on that day: "Give thanks to the LORD; call on his name; make known his deeds among the nations; proclaim that his name is exalted. ⁵ Sing praises to the LORD, for he has done gloriously; let this be known in all the earth. ⁶ Shout aloud and sing for joy, O royal Zion, for great in your midst is the Holy One of Israel."

Isaiah 12:3-6 NRSV

In a survey of more than 700 subjects, Kathy Caprino — a senior contributor at *Forbes*, marriage and family therapist, and career coach — asked respondents to identify what they most desperately wanted in life. The question was: "If you could say in one word what you want more of in life, what would that be?" The number 1 response was happiness. Joy came in at number 5. Money was number 2. Other answers were freedom, peace, balance, fulfillment and confidence. The participants in the survey clearly identified a distinction between happiness and joy. Usually those who discuss this distinction say that happiness is a form of *conditional* joy. Happiness, according to this line of thought, is a momentary feeling of elation stimulated by some external yet positive event that has occurred in one's life. Joy, on the other hand, is a stream that flows deep and steady and is not affected too much by whatever turbulence may be at the surface of one's life. Caprino's audience would rather have happiness than joy. They'd rather have freedom than joy; peace than joy. Most importantly, they'd rather experience periodic bursts of giddy insanity than anything else.¹

Isaiah was a prophet who gave God's word to several kings of Judah during a time of crisis in the land. Judah was under threat of invasion by foreign powers, and, as God's mouthpiece, Isaiah was to offer a sign from God to strengthen the people's hope. To the surprise of everyone Isaiah didn't tell them that God was going to provide more horses or chariots, swords or spears to keep at bay the invasion. Instead, the sign was a baby. "The young woman is with child and shall bear a son, and name him Emmanuel" (Isa. 7:14). "A child has been born for us; a son given to us. Authority rests on his shoulders and he is named Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace" (Isa. 9:6).

One night long ago, an event occurred that was both terrifying and exciting. The Lord of Heaven stopped by in a village, and the Lord stayed for about 33 years. His arrival was announced by angels, and notice a particular word that appears in the proclamation: Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, 'Do not be afraid; for see — I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord (Luke 2:10-11). Joy. Great joy. For all people. Advent! As we enter the Advent season, a time of expectation and preparation, may we receive God's gift of joy found in Jesus Christ.



Health & Wellness: From our Parish Nurse

Has reflecting on this past year changed you? How does one's faith and lifestyle affect us and others? A definition of lifestyle is, "A way of life or style of living that reflects the attitudes and values of a person or group." No matter what your age or where you are in your life today, it is never too late to improve your lifestyle, to make the most of your health and wellbeing. This also applies to our faith journey. Being stronger both physically and mentally allows for greater resis-

tance to illness and faster healing. We truly need each other and God in our lives.

Trusting in God is also a way of practicing optimism. Prayer is a gift for all of us to exercise that allows us to communicate directly with God. A sincere, frequent, and frank talk with God provides opportunities for introspection. Praying for help encourages us to examine what we truly need and what we are requesting from God. It is a personal act that can be performed alone or with others and can provide a great source of stress relief.

All relationships require good communication in order to be maintained and grown.

It is no different when talking with God. Prayer should be a regular daily part of our life. What's nice about prayer is that it can happen anytime and anywhere. The more we choose this gift given to us and are thankful for prayer, the more we can see the benefits. Often, prayers are given at the beginning and end of each day. The verses listed are just a few to help encourage us, and ones you may want to share with someone. Here is an exercise, and I hope these verses will spark the desire to read the Bible and to memorize your favorites.

Jeremiah 29:11 is one of my favorites: For I know the plans I have for you, declares the Lord, plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future and Psalm 46:10: Be still and

know that I am God.

Let the gift of reading the Bible or listening by CD enable us to trust God and grow closer to Him by exercising the power of prayer. Let our grace story and "lifestyle" continue to forge our family of faith at Court Street this December and beyond.






