170 YEARS OF COURT STREET

"The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory..."

John 1:14, NIV



They say that seeing is believing, and art is often about putting into visual form what has only been imagined not actually seen. One example of how the Visual Arts made the Spirit tangible and accessible to the mind and eye includes the influence of former Court Street Pastor Charles R. Goff (1933-1942) upon the artist Warner Sallman, particularly Sallman's creation of the painting "Head of Christ."

Created before 1942, Sallman's "Head of Christ" has become one of the best known images of the imagined "face" of the Master and could be considered a Protestant icon. In the Court Street ar-

chive is a *Rockford Register Star* article from June of 1971 that tells the backstory of the image, relaying how Goff inspired Sallman's creation during a lecture series at the Chicago Central YMCA. After Goff left Court Street to become pastor of the Chicago Temple in 1942, he finally met Sallman and learned of his impact on the artist's work. Through this connection, the Chicago Temple came to own a pastel drawn by Sallman himself. As for Court Street, after the fire of 1969 and subsequent reconstruction, Goff gifted our church with a stained glass replica, which still hangs in the Narthex. Like the stained glass work in the Chapel, Court Street's "Head of Christ" is backlit to beautiful effect (pictured above).

Health & Wellness: From our Parish Nurse

ctober is National Domestic Violence Awareness month. What is domestic violence? It's not just the degree of a visible sign, like a black eye or bruises from punches, that defines an act of abusive behavior. It is the presence of the behavior itself and the resulting atmosphere of power and control. Abuse and battering is any and all acts that harm, gain, or maintain power and control over another person. Domestic violence has many forms and includes, but is not limited to, physical, emotional, psychological, economic, sexual abuse, or sexual exploitation. It is any threatening behavior that holds back an individual's personal power and/or creates an atmosphere of fear and intimidation.

Domestic violence affects both men, women, and children of every race, religion, culture, and status. It is without a doubt that this behavior surpasses all demographics in all areas of our community and communities around the world.

Many private and public organizations have been working hard to bring more evidence based programs and facilities to Rockford and the surrounding communities. In May of 2019, Mayor McNamara announced that the newest facility would be called the Family Peace Center; survivors of domestic violence informed city officials that the name should be warm and welcoming for survivors and their children. The Rockford Family Peace Center is an organization that has a multi-agency, multi-disciplinary, and co-located service center that provides services to victims of interpersonal violence, including intimate partner violence, sexual assault, child abuse, elder or dependent adult abuse, and human trafficking. Both public and private agencies provide services from one location. The Center's goals are to reduce the number of times victims have to tell their stories, the number of places they must go for help, and to increase access to services, and support victims and their children.

It has been documented and published outcomes show that Family Justice Centers like the Family Peace Center have helped their communities. The statistics show reduced homicides, increased victim safety, increased autonomy and empowerment for victims, reduced fear and anxiety for families, reduced recantation and minimization of victims when wrapped in services and support, increased efficiency in collaborative services to victims among service providers, increased prosecution of offenders, and dramatically increased community support for services to victims and their children.

The Family Peace Center in Rockford is the first Family Justice Center of its kind in Illinois. Through its doors, it has seen over 1,000 survivors in a little over two years. Their goal is not to have anyone fall between the cracks.

Data from February 2022 shows that 4 in 10 crimes committed in Rockford were domestic violence related. These calls are also some of the most dangerous for police to respond to. First responders are trained

to ask eleven critical questions of victims by helping victims to immediately call and connect them to a 24/7 hotline for help and shelter if needed. In the last five years, the rate of domestic violence in Rockford rose by 11.6%. New stats from August 2022 shows that for the first seven months of this year violent crimes have fallen by 2%. Unfortunately, property crimes, robberies, and auto theft have increased. We are finding out that we need to reach children at an even younger age for better intervention. More than the majority of juveniles that are arrested for violent offenses either witnessed domestic violence in their homes or were victims themselves.

Another agency that I would like to mention is Remedies Renewing Lives. Remedies is a 24/7 domestic violence shelter. Remedies is a non-profit organization

that helps victims of domestic violence and offers outpatient addiction and mental health services as well as medication assistance treatments. Remedies also provides a safe and supportive environment with critical client centered services to promote healing of individuals and families. It has been helping the community for over 60 years and continues to evolve to help the community.

As a concerned and informed citizen, please continue to pray for our city, our officials, and all victims and survivors as we move forward. The church has a domestic violence committee; please call the office if you would like to learn more and find ways to help.





SUNDAY, OCTOBER $30^{\rm TH}$ AFTER THE 10:00 AM SERVICE How To Help Yourself To Tax SAvings and Benefit Your Church or Other Charities

We have invited Scott Laue of Savant Wealth Management to give us a presentation on how to use our Required Minimum Distributions towards tax breaks for ourselves and benefits for our church. As many of you know, once you hit a "magic age," the government requires you to take out a minimum amount from your IRA (Individual Retirement Account). That age is currently 72 years old (or 70 ½ if you reached 70 ½ before 1/1/2020). Savant is the entity that manages Court Street's Endowment Fund. The presentation is NOT to sell anyone anything or to invest with them but to help us make better informed decisions about how to use our assets in our retirement accounts.

Another aspect that he will be covering is QCD (Qualified Charitable Distributions). A QCD is a monetary contribution up to \$100,000 to a charity or church directly from your IRA by your fund manager. You are never in direct possession of those funds in your personal savings or checking accounts. The charity would have

to have a Federal Tax ID number that would have to be supplied to the manager of your IRA. That is because your fund manager will report your QCD to the IRS so that it will NOT count towards your taxable income for the year you gave it to the charity. You do NOT have to itemize your taxes to get this benefit. Scott will explain all these aspects (and maybe more) in his presentation. He will have paper handouts to go with his Power Point presentation.


