

Health & Wellness: From our Parish Nurse

want to wish everyone a Happy New Year and to pray that we all take precautions to stay well this year. I hope the graph below helps to assist you during these winter months. During the past 50 years, immunizations have saved more than a billion lives and prevented countless illnesses and disabilities in the U.S. To stay protected against serious illnesses like COVID, flu, measles, pneumonia, shingles, and whooping cough, adults (like children) need to be current with their immunizations.


In recent years, there have been increased cases and outbreaks of whooping cough in different parts of the country. Whooping cough is a highly contagious disease that can be serious, even fatal, for infants. Many people who spread whooping cough may not know they have it. It is easily spread through coughing and sneezing. It may appear like a common cold, with a runny nose, congestion, sneezing, and maybe a mild cough and mild fever. But after 1-2 weeks, severe coughing begins. These severe coughing fits can last up to three months in adults. It is a fact that about 50% of infants under the age of 12 months that come down with whooping cough need to be hospitalized. Infants are too young to be fully vaccinated against whooping cough.

Remember, immunity from whooping cough and

other vaccines fade over time. Adults should get the Tdap vaccine shot every 10 years. The pertussis (whooping cough) part of the vaccine and the Td (tetanus & diphtheria) is the rest of the vaccine. Pregnant women are advised to be vaccinated also. The Department of Health and Human Services would like 70% of the population in the U.S. to be vaccinated from influenza, but we are far from that. Typically the flu vaccine is 40-60% effective. This year's version of the flu vaccine appears to be effective against this widely circulating strain. It is still not too late to be vaccinated for the flu. Remember, if you think you have the flu let your healthcare provider know right away to see if you are a candidate for Tamiflu to help less-



Thank you to everyone who cooked meals, donated funds, and mentored this fall. We are making plans for our third class starting in March. Stay tuned for more updates.
