Get to Know God Better!

²² So Paul stood before the Areopagus and said, "Men of Athens, I see that you are very religious in all respects. ²³ For as I went around and observed closely your objects of worship, I even found an altar with this inscription: 'To an unknown god.' Therefore, what you worship without knowing it, this I proclaim to you.

Acts 17:22-23, NET



The "unknown god" is the subject of Paul's message to the Athenians. Paul realized that we all need to be reminded of the expression in (verse 28): "In him we live and move and have our being." God is not Someone "who lives in shrines built by human hands," for one (v. 24); second, he is not "served by human hands, as though he needed anything, since he himself gives to all humans life and breath and all things" (v. 25); and third, God is not "an image formed by the art and imagination of humans" (v. 29). In other words, God does not dwell in these buildings we call cathedrals and churches; we do not serve God because God needs to be served, but only because it is "our reasonable act of wor-

ship" (Romans 12:1) to do so; and last, God is more than an image we ourselves construct and imagine. God rejects our attempts to cast him in our own image; instead, he calls us to "*repent*" (v. 30) and be made in the image of God.

Paul continues this same rhetoric in Hebrews chapter 2:10: "God, for whom and through whom all things exist." Okay, most of us can go with "through whom." But "for whom" — now that gets a bit personal. Although God is gracious and kind, we need to remember that we exist for God, not God for us. And whatever you do to pursue a deeper relationship with God, remember: "Do not be conformed to this age, but be transformed by the renewing of the mind, so that you may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect." (Romans 12:2). Everything we do is supposed to be for God's glory: "So whether you eat or drink, or whatever you do, do everything for the glory of God," (1 Corinthians 10:31). All creation — stars, seas, mountains, trees, animals — all praise God by their very existence (Psalm 148).

Our whole "person," — body, mind, heart, and soul — exists by God's pleasure and for God's pleasure. As we examine our lives and make resolutions to live out for the new year, are there patterns of thought or action we need to bring in line with this reality? If we look back at last year, what things could we say were not "for God"? This mindset can be a powerful way to resist self-indulgence. We exist for God's desires before our own. That is the bottom line that keeps us in line.

Happy New Year and may you; "Get to Know God Better!"






Health & Wellness: From Our Parish Nurse




