

1 Corinthians 13:1-13 (NRSV)

(NT) pg. 175

1 Corinthians 13:1-13 (The Message)

"The Way of Love"

13 If I speak with human eloquence and angelic ecstasy but don't love, I'm nothing but the creaking of a rusty gate. 2 If I speak God's Word with power,

revealing all his mysteries and making everything plain as day, and if I have faith that says to a mountain, "Jump," and it jumps, but I don't love, I'm nothing.

3-7 If I give everything I own to the poor and even go to the stake to be burned as a martyr, but I don't love, I've gotten nowhere. So, no matter what I say, what I believe, and what I do, I'm bankrupt without love.

Love never gives up.

Love cares more for others than for self.

Love doesn't want what it doesn't have.

Love doesn't strut,

Doesn't have a swelled head,

Doesn't force itself on others,

Isn't always "me first,"

Doesn't fly off the handle,

Doesn't keep score of the sins of others,

Doesn't revel when others grovel,

Takes pleasure in the flowering of truth,

Puts up with anything,

Trusts God always,

Always looks for the best,

Never looks back,

But keeps going to the end.

8-10 Love never dies. Inspired speech will be over some day; praying in tongues will end; understanding will reach its limit. We know only a portion of the truth, and what we say about God is always incomplete. But when the Complete arrives, our incompletes will be canceled. 11 When I was an infant at my mother's breast, I gurgled and cooed like any infant. When I grew up, I left those infant ways for good. 12 We don't yet see things clearly. We're squinting in a fog, peering through a mist. But it won't be long before the weather clears and the sun shines bright! We'll see it all then, see it all as clearly as God sees us, knowing him directly just as he knows us! 13 But for right now, until that completeness, we have three things to do to lead us toward that consummation: Trust steadily in God, hope unswervingly, love extravagantly. And the best of the three is love.

THE SACRAMENT OF HOLY COMMUNION

(In the United Church of Christ, we practice an Open Table. You need not be a church member to commune; you need only a sincere desire to draw near to Christ and seek peace with your neighbor. Saturday and Sunday communion elements are offered by coming forward or are available on the bulletin/offering table. Grape juice is in the center circle of the tray and wine fills the cups around it.)

Leader: The Lord be with you.

<u>People:</u> And also with you. <u>Leader:</u> Lift up your hearts.

People: We lift them up to the Lord.

Leader: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People: It is right to give our thanks and praise.

<u>Leader:</u> Holy, Almighty God, Creator of heaven and earth, with joy we praise you and give thanks to your name.

<u>Leader:</u> In love you commanded light to shine out of darkness, divided the sea and dry land, creating the vast universe and calling it good.

<u>People:</u> You loved us into living, molding us in your image to live with you and one another in love. You gave us the breath of life and freedom to choose your way. You promised yourself in covenant with Abraham and Sarah, told us your purpose in commandments through Moses, and called for justice in the cry of the prophets.

<u>Leader:</u> Through long generations you have been lovingly faithful to all your children.

<u>Leader:</u> Great and wonderful are your works, loving God. Your ways are true and just. Therefore, we lift our hearts in joyful praise, joining our voices with choirs of angels, and with all the faithful of every time and place, who forever sing to the glory of your name.

<u>People:</u> Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

<u>Leader:</u> We praise you, most holy God, for sending your only Son. Freely living among us, sharing our joy and sorrow, he told your story, healed the sick and was a friend of sinners. Obeying you, he took up his cross and died that we might live.

<u>People:</u> We praise you that he overcame death and is risen to rule the world, and yet he is still befriending us sinners. We trust him to overcome every power that can hurt or divide us, and believe that when he comes in glory, we will celebrate victory with you.

WORDS OF INSTITUTION

<u>Leader:</u> Remembering all your mighty and merciful acts, we break bread and share one cup, giving thanks for your saving love in Jesus Christ.

<u>People:</u> Pour out your Holy Spirit upon us and upon these gifts of bread and cup. Make them for us the body and blood of Christ that we may be for the world the body of Christ, redeemed by his blood.

<u>Leader:</u> As you raised our Lord from death, calling us with him from death to life, we joyfully give ourselves to you to live for him in joy and grateful praise.

<u>Leader:</u> Great indeed is the mystery of faith:

People: Christ has died,

Christ is risen,

Christ will come again.

Leader: Christ is the bread of life:

<u>People:</u> When we eat this bread, and drink this cup, we proclaim the death of our risen Lord until he comes again.

Leader: And now, according to his commandment;

<u>People:</u> We remember his death, we proclaim his resurrection, we await his coming in glory.

<u>Leader:</u> Gracious and loving God, we praise you for once again nourishing us with the body and blood of Christ our Lord. We praise you for lifting us up to enjoy, for just a moment, the divine peace and serene joy of your heavenly realm.

<u>People:</u> Now, send us out in the power of the Spirit to live for others, as Christ lived for us, announcing his death for the sins of the world, and telling his resurrection to all people and nations. Empower us, where experience cannot afford, to place ourselves in the suffering of others, sharing with them and so bearing witness to the suffering of Christ and his healing grace.

<u>Leader:</u> By your Spirit, draw us together into one body and join us to Christ the Lord, that we may remain his glad and faithful people until we feast with him in glory.

We offer our sacrifice of praise and prayers in the name of Christ himself, who taught us how to love well when he taught us to pray by saying, Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our debts as we forgive our debtors. Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever. Amen.

Following Today's Worship Service - There will be a reception in the assembly room meet and greet with Rev. Christian Chavarria from El Salvador.

The Subversive Cross was a very large cross that was placed on the center aisle in the Lutheran church (there are no UCC churches in El Salvador) during their civil war (1980-1992). Those going to church were encouraged to write their sins and the sins of the country upon this cross. The soldiers came to arrest Bishop Gomez. Someone had come and warned the Bishop that they were coming. He escaped to the German embassy and then to the USA. After three months, he returned to El Salvador and was accompanied by a delegation of American pastors of different denominations, catholic and protestant. The soldiers could not arrest him then. The cross, which was put in jail, was returned and holds a special significance for this church. The small cross on our altar today is a replica of this cross. The original cross hangs in the Resurrection Lutheran Church in San Salvador.
