This coming Sunday, November 14 will be full. We will recognize our military veterans and active duty personnel during worship. We will offer our financial pledges for 2022 to God in worship. # People: We ask your blessing.


One: For veterans who came home but couldn't "fit in" with their families or communities anymore,

## TIME FOR THE CHILD WITHIN US: Fully Rely On God

Last week you received a Time Chart. You were challenged to chart how you spend your time for a week, then evaluate how you use the precious time we have been gifted by God.

Today, on our last stewardship Sunday, you received a frog. Why? Because this cute critter's name tells us how to live: Fully Rely On God.

**FROG**. As you prayerfully consider how much you and your household will financially pledge to God through St. Paul Church in 2022, I remind you that the very best thing you can do is to Fully Rely On God—placing God at the center of your life AND seeking to serve Jesus by serving those who are hungry and hurting, those who are sick and solitary. <sup>46-47</sup> "Why are you so polite with me, always saying 'Yes, sir,' and 'That's right, sir,' but never doing a thing I tell you? These words I speak to you are not mere additions to your life, homeowner improvements to your standard of living. They are foundation words, words to build a life on.

<sup>48-49</sup> "If you work the words into your life, you are like a smart carpenter who dug deep and laid the foundation of his house on bedrock. When the river burst its banks and crashed against the house, nothing could shake it; it was built to last. But if you just use my words in Bible studies and don't work them into your life, you are like a dumb carpenter who built a house but skipped the foundation. When the swollen river came crashing in, it collapsed like a house of cards. It was a total loss."

### SERMON

Rev. Becky Erb Strang

On this fourth and final Stewardship Sunday, we have reached the heart of Jesus' Sermon on the Plain. Amidst his topsy-turvy words about smudges on faces, bad fruit, shaking foundations and floods, we begin to catch a glimpse of Jesus' vision of discipleship.

Service to God IS a radical change of life—it means welcoming the poor and refugees into our homes, refusing to pass judgment on others, expressing gratitude, sharing blessings, and building a firm foundation—a foundation that builds up the kingdom of God (or literally translated from the Greek—to allow God to rule our lives/to Fully Rely On God—that frog again.)

Luke's version of Jesus' Sermon on the Plain is masterful—it weaves image upon image of blessing and woes, poverty and abundance, love and hatred, acceptance and judgment, smudges and fruit that become a tapestry of discipleship. Following Jesus means more than dusting off our

Bibles. Following Jesus means living like him—knowing that our lives, our words, our actions, are the best witnesses to God we can possibly offer.

The Sermon on the Plain reminds me of the woven tapestry the Prayer Chain has been weaving for years. In my early years at St. Paul, the Prayer Chain folk met fairly regularly. During our time together, we would take scraps of fabric, sticks, feathers, paper, and wool—each symbolizing a prayer that we carried in our hearts. As we wove our tiny bits into the loom, we were struck by the beauty of the whole. No one piece of the material matches another. There are knots, frayed bits, holes, and lumps—but none of that matters.

What matters is that our tiny bits of prayer, our puny scraps of faith, our broken-and-tied-together remnants of our lives are woven with love. What matters is HOW we use the scraps of our lives, the abundance of our living, the blessings we have been given, the forgiveness we are offered, and the challenges of our days. What matters is what we do with what we have been given—how we share grace, spread peace, speak out against injustice, and make a real difference in the lives of those who have been pushed aside by society again and again and again.

When Jesus finished speaking on that warm sunny day, some people probably went home inspired. Others might have left everything and followed him. Still others probably dismissed his words as too harsh or too inconvenient.

We, too, have a choice to make today. Following Jesus IS difficult—choosing peace and forgiveness, acceptance and generosity is completely counter to our national culture. Yet, as followers of Jesus/as Christians—we are called out of our pews, our dining rooms and our kitchen tables to serve others with all we have. We are called to be generous and then generous some more. We are challenged to offer hope in these precarious times.

Fully Relying On God, we can do this!!!! Amen.

## OFFERING AND DEDICATING OUR 2022 PLEDGES TO GOD

Once a year, St. Paul UCC members and friends make financial commitments to the mission and ministries of our congregation for the coming year. For the past four weeks, we have focused worship around our stewardship theme: Called to Serve—Loving God & Loving Neighbor.

If you are a guest with us today, don't be uncomfortable. This commitment service is something we do each year—reminding us that we are called to offer our whole lives to God.

If you are a member and do not wish to complete the pledge cards, we do not want you to feel pressured to do so. We do hope you will consider this, but it is a totally, voluntary process.

Journalist B.C. Forbes once said, "The be-all and end-all of life should not be to get rich, but to enrich the world." We enrich the world through our joyful generosity of our time, our talents, our treasures. Generosity is not one aspect of life apart from the rest of life. Generosity is a way of living, not only a way of giving.

In your pews you will find pledge cards. I invite you to take a moment now to complete the information on the cards.

You will notice that the pledge cards are in three parts. One portion you keep for your records. On another portion you record your name. On the third portion the percentage of your income you prayerfully commit to give to the missions and ministries of St. Paul for 2022.

Each time we celebrate the Lord's Supper—Holy Communion—we take in our hands a small piece of bread and a small cup with ordinary grape juice or wine. During those moments, these common elements symbolize the deepest meanings of our faith. During the next few minutes when we take an ordinary pencil and a small card, these symbolizing the high and holy commitment we make in response to the love God has given each of us.

Pope Francis once said: *Money has to serve, not to rule*. We are entrusted to care for all of God's creation—and that includes our financial resources. Take a moment to complete your cards. Then bring your cards forward, placing your name card in one basket and your giving card in the second basket.

PRAYER OF DEDICATION (in unison)

Gracious and loving God, giver of all that is good and true and beautiful and life-giving. These cards represent our sweat. They represent our lives. They represent our dreams. The financial commitments we make are but tokens of the awesome gifts that have been given to us by you. 


